Waterproofing Outside Walls

Dance Training Is Billed at OSC During Summer

Oregon State College—A summer session workshop program in camp education and in the modern dance and American folk dance in physical education have been arranged here for beginning dates of June 20 and July 25.

Under the camp education program students will be on the campus from June 20 to 24 for preliminary training in camp counseling. They may then take camp positions from June 25 to August 7, during which they will gain supervised experience with the college instructor working through camp directors. Those enrolled will then return to the campus August 8 to 13 to complete credit course requirements. Miss Margaret Milliken, instructor in physical education, will be director.

A workshop in modern dance will be held June 20 to July 1 under the direction of Miss Betty Lynd Thompson, associate professor of physical education here. It is planned especially for teachers who have had little or no training in creative dance.

The American folk dance workshop will be from July 25 to August 6 with Miss Erma Weir, instructor in physical education, as director. It will give opportunity for concentrated study for both undergraduates and graduate students interested in recreational leadership.

1949 Brand Law Effective Now

All movement of certain classes of livestock—cattle, horses, mules and asses—in Oregon is now subject to the new Oregon livestock identification and theft prevention act. The law (chapter 193, Oregon Laws 1949 or house bill 373) carried an emergency clause and became effective immediately upon signature of the governor on March 19.

Known as the brand inspection law, the new act was sponsored by a long list of livestock organizations. It replaces chapter 404, Oregon Laws 1947.

The act contains several features not found in previous brand inspection laws in this state, points out M. E. Knickerbocker, chief of the division of animal industry of the state department of agriculture which is responsible for its enforcement.

One of the major changes makes the application of this law state wide. Now there are no areas in the state exempt from the requirements for brand inspection of livestock in movement.

Another new feature sets up a livestock advisory committee, named by the governor and including one representative from the Western Oregon Livestock association, one from the Oregon Dairymen's association and three from the Oregon Cattlemen's association. The director of agriculture is an ex-officio member of the committee, powers and duties of which are to advise and assist the department in connection with matters arising under the brand inspection law.

Named to the advisory committee were Verne Colvin, Innaha, Robert Lister, Pauline, and William F. Kittredge, Klamath Falls, all representing the Oregon Cattlemen's association; Dr. Kent Magruder, Clatskanie, Western Oregon Livestock association; and Chris Hoffman, Bay City, Oregon Dairymen's association. Lister was chosen chairman and Dr. Magruder, secretary of the committee at the first meeting April 20. By lot, the terms of office are: Lister, one year; Magruder and Hoffman, two years; Colvin and Kittredge, three years.

As soon as possible names and location of brand inspectors serving this area will be released.

NO ONE BLAMED FOR DEATHS IN DRAIN CRASH

Verdict that Clark F. Bartholomy and his wife, June, lost their lives in a train-auto collision at Drain March 19 and that "no one was guilty of a crime thereby" was returned by a coroner's jury in an inquest at Drain Tuesday night.

This was reported by Coroner Harry C. Stearns, who said that the jury was unable to determine who was driving the pick-up truck, struck by the northbound train 330 as the vehicle was crossing the Southern Pacific tracks in Drain.—Roseburg News Review.

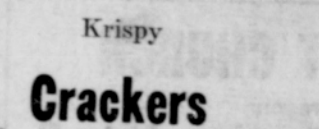
