A well-balanced band of Cottage Grove Lion Harriers easily waited away with the annual Tri-county meet at Hayward Field in Eugene Saturday, garnering 85 points, as compared against Newport's second place 40.
Continuing to break records, Wes Thompson leaped 20' 9½" in the broad jump and Al Martin clipped off the low hurdles in :23.7, furnish winning points in these events. The Lion relay team also lowered the meet record with a speedy 1:37.4 performance. Martin went on to tie the present record in the half mile run, overtaking University High's Dave Fletcher in a brilliant kick at the finish. His time was 2:04.3.
Ted Anderson was the whole show on the Newport club, as the speedy senior equalled the :10.4 record in the hundred and then went on to better his own record in the 220, pacing the distance in :22.8. His time last year in this event was 23.3. John Schneider of that same squad also bettered his last year's mark in the shot put event with a heave of 43' 2".
