NOTICE OF SCHOOL ELECTION UPON QUESTION OF INCREASING TAX LEVY OVER AMOUNT LIMITED BY SECTION 11, ARTICLE XI, STATE CONSTITUTION

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in School District No. 45 of Lane County, State of Oregon, at Supt. Office, Jefferson School, Cottage Grove, Oregon, from 2:00 to 7:00 P. M.
