She was born of pioneer parents, September 13, 1863 at Dunton, Illinois, afterwards named Arlington Heights. She was educated in Cook county, Illinois and Wisconsin schools and taught school for many years. She lived in Evanston, Illinois and Scottsbluff, Nebraska until moving to Oregon in 1931.

350 Laws Will Be Effective 18th

relative approved budgets in event of falling costs. Authority of the governor to declare a state of emergency due to earthquake, flood or other disaster imperiling the life or property of citizens is provided in another law.

Premises used for profit and for gambling or lottery by any person, corporation or partnership would be a common nuisance subject to penalties under another act.

Another act increases the annual fee of active members of the Oregon state GAR from \$6 to \$12 a year.

Cities and towns, through another law, would have the right to finance by general obligation or revenue bonds, benefit assessments, special charge and general taxation, purchase of property for parking facilities.

Candidates for party nomination at the primary election must affirm that they have been members of that party for the prior six months, another enactment provides.

Two retirement acts provide for permitting employees under the state retirement law to continue work after they reach the age of 65 years.

Banks and trust companies shall be permitted to close Saturdays. Upon liquidation of a bank all assets shall be pooled for benefit of commercial and savings depositors.

Increases state bakery license fees from \$5 to \$10 a year. Regulates sale and use of fireworks in Oregon and provides for a license.

Permits creation of districts for establishment of hospitals and provides manner of financing and operation.

Authorizes state highway commission to finance funds to counties for repair of weather damaged roads and bridges not exceeding one half of each county's share of the state highway fund disbursed between July 1, 1947, and April 1, 1949.

Allows state board of control to contract with other states to house and provide care for women convicts from Oregon and vice versa. Making it a misdemeanor to wound a person with a bullet due to failure to use ordinary care.

Makes window peeping a misdemeanor. Increasing poundage fees for fish.

Requires an automobile to halt when a school bus stops to discharge or take on passengers. Requires logging trucks under certain conditions, to stop at railroad crossings. State board of higher education may give tuition free scholarships in state educational institutions, including teachers training, to applicants from Hawaii and Alaska.

One outstanding bill of the 1945 legislature, increasing the basic school fund from \$50 to \$80 per pupil of school-age census, was referred to the voters at the next general election for approval or rejection.

Two other laws, one providing for a minimum \$50 a month pension for elderly persons, provide funds are available, and the other giving the governor authority to declare state-wide daylight saving time, may be subjected to referendum attack.

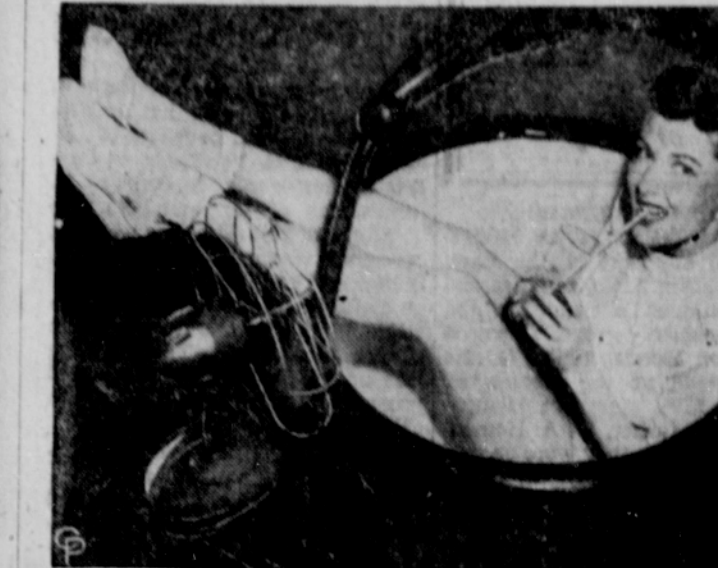

Precautions Suggested To Cut Haying Mishaps

Haying mishaps annually account for a large percentage of the mounting farm accident toll. National Safety council points out in urging farmers to take extra precautions during the haying season.

To reduce hazards and thus avoid disastrous losses, here are a few suggestions:

Carefully check all equipment for defective hitchers, ropes, pulleys, lifts, hay racks or ladders. Left floors should be put in good repair and hay chutes guarded.

Make starts and stops gradually in all haying operations and watch out for falls from hay racks, hay stacks and hay mows.

Machinery should be stopped and thrown out of gear before oiling, adjusting or unclogging, and safety guards should be kept in place at all times.

Pitchforks are dangerous; always place them where they are in plain sight of all workers. Never throw a pitchfork.

Do not wear loose or ragged clothing which may catch easily in moving machinery.

Damp hay is one of the principal causes of barn fires. Be sure the hay is well cured before storing and check regularly for several weeks for any signs of heating.

Two Row Stalk-Cutter



The two row stalk-cutter is turned on its skids for transport between fields. When reversed (with cutting blades on reel removed) and riding on cutter blades, the tool levels corn stalks so the ground can be prepared more easily for the next crop. Are welding makes a rigid frame that is required when the cutter is hauled through a field behind a tractor.

Honey Bread

Federal regulations require that bread sold under a brand name with the word "honey" in it must contain at least 8 per cent honey. Bread sold under a brand name which includes the word "milk" must contain milk.
