Brown and white dress.

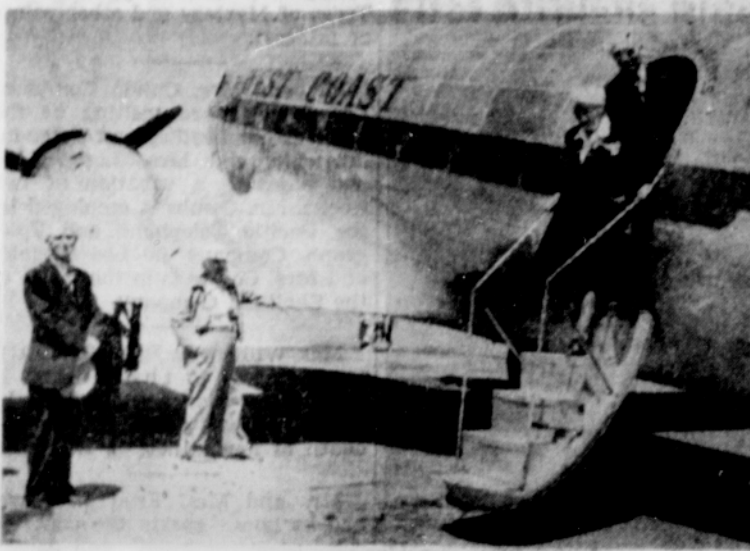

Use Thrifty Cuts of Lamb

LAMB comes to the Springfield table, and while it is fine to have a succulent roast leg of lamb or a brace of thick loin chops, don't neglect the thrifty cuts.

All cuts of lamb are tender and may be cooked by dry heat—broiling, pan-broiling or roasting—which should be done at low heat (300° F., with no searing first required).

As for the fell, that thin parchment-like covering, there is still some controversy about this. From all accounts it's probably better off the shoulder, rack or saddle, is much better left on the leg. But it is a matter of individual choice.

Try a cushion shoulder roast for something good and different. Have retailer bone the square cut shoulder so as to make a pocket. It is then sewed around the edges leaving one side open for the stuffing. Make a good stuffing (celery, onion, parsley is recommended), skewer the opening, and roast without water, allowing 40 min. per pound for roasting.

Lamb shanks may be inexpensive, a real thrifty cut, but when well prepared, come up as a good, tasty and nourishing dish. Buy a lamb shank for each person to be served. Season with salt and pepper, dredge with flour and brown in hot fat. Place in baking dish, and pour the drippings over it. Cover and cook in 300° F. oven for about 2 hours.

Lamb Loaf

For a lamb loaf you'll need about 2 lb. of ground lamb for 6 servings. Prepare it as you would any other meat loaf, combining with an egg, seasonings to taste (minced parsley, onion, green pepper, etc., as well as salt and pepper). Use milk to moisten. Bake in 300° F. for about an hour. Serve with potatoes browned in the pan. Baked onions, string beans or tomatoes are good with a lamb loaf.

Good lamb notions include these ideas: Add chop fresh mint to bread stuffing to add interest to stuffed lamb shoulder. Add some barley to your next lamb stew!

Household Hint

To make dishwashing easier, rinse your dishes after they have been brought to the kitchen to be washed. With a sink strainer placed under the running tap, all particles of food can be washed directly into it, and the contents dumped into the garbage container. A small vegetable brush or rubber scraper helps the process. Cold water quickly removes milk, starchy foods and egg; hot water takes care of the grease.
