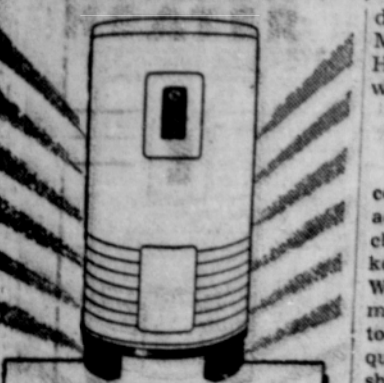

Accidents Take Lives of 5 People In Lane County

Accidents over the week end took the lives of five people over the county. Two were drowned. Floyd Poole, a resident of Springfield section, drowned at the Martin Rapids on the McKenzie. Fred C. Farquar, 72, of route 2, Junction City, was killed in a fall from a roof. Jean Skelly of Newport was drowned in Siltcoos lake and also presumed dead was a Mr. Simpkins, companion of Jean Skelly.

Floyd Poole was drowned Saturday evening when a pin in his motor boat sheared as he neared the rapids and his boat overturned. Mr. Farquar fell from the roof of his home while he was shingling it, and died later in a Eugene hospital. Monday police were investigating a possible double drowning at Siltcoos lake after it was reported that Jean Skelly drowned and after her empty boat was found.

The fifth person to meet death by accident was Miss Elsie M. Andersen, 62, of Eugene, who was struck by a Eugene police patrol car Saturday evening. Miss Andersen died a few hours later in a Eugene hospital. Louis T. Arnold, driver of the Eugene police car, was not held although an inquest was ordered.

To Keep Nuts
To avoid rancidity in nuts, keep them in an airtight container in a cool dry place away from the light. The container will also help to protect the nuts from insects.

Brood sow litters containing as much as one-fourth of alfalfa hay or meal are being recommended by some veterinarians as a means of curbing losses of baby pigs.

Swimming Classes Are Discontinued

The swimming classes have been discontinued at the Cottage Grove lake, Robert Dusenberry, recreation director announced Tuesday. Dusenberry said the main part of the swim program had been completed but that the recreation committee planned to run the swim bus for this week until a report was received from Lt. Col. Walter R. Lalonde, resident engineer at the lake stating that the water was a little on the negative side.

Commenting on the report, Lt. Col. Lalonde said water samples from the lake were submitted to the state sanitary authority regularly and only recently the water in the swimming area was found a little on the negative side. Out 400 feet or more from the dam the water is safe enough, but a south-west wind brought in debris near the swimming area, which has contaminated the water.

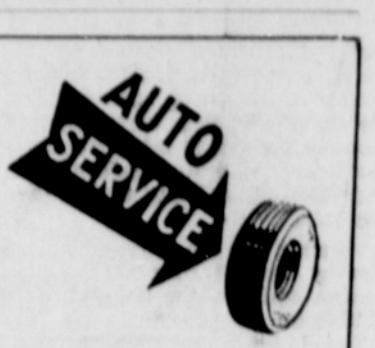

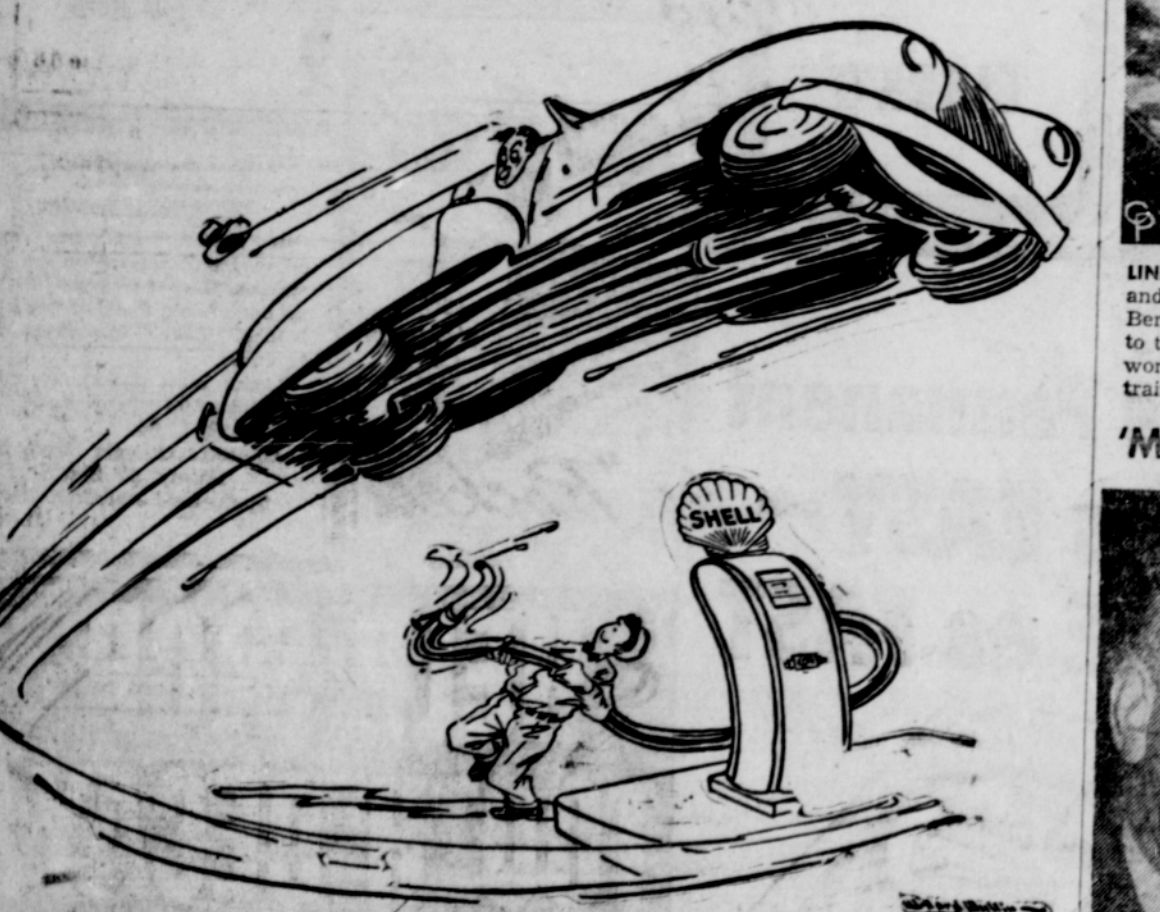
