

Pharmacy, Home Ec Draw Many at OSC

Oregon State College—Increased interest in pharmacy and home economics is showing in applications received thus far from new students planning to enter Oregon State this fall, according to registrar's reports.

Pharmacy applications are more than a third higher than last year at this time, indicating a continuation of the growth of that school which has grown steadily in the past few years.

Home economics applications have held almost exactly the same as last year in the face of a leveling off and some reduction in other schools and divisions. In recent years home economics graduates seeking positions have had more offered them than they could accept.

Indications are that the new class of freshmen and transfers this fall will contain a somewhat larger percentage of girls than has been true in the immediate postwar years. New student week begins Monday, September 19, with registration scheduled the last three days for all students.

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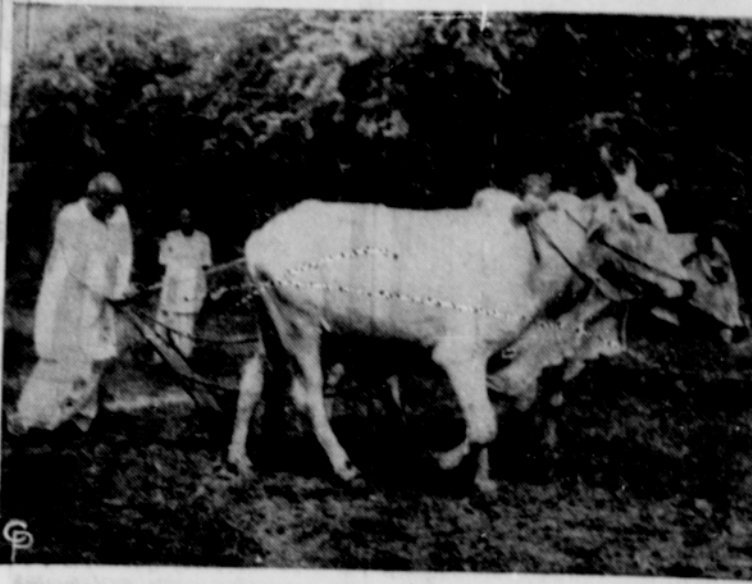

INVITING PROPOSALS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A SEWER IN GIBBS AVENUE AND CHERRY COURT, COTTAGE GROVE, OREGON

Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the City Recorder, of the City of Cottage Grove, Oregon, until September 6, 1949, at 8:00 o'clock p.m. for the construction of a sewer in Gibbs Avenue and North Seventh Street to Cherry Court and thence North to a point twenty feet South of the South line of Woods Avenue, in the manner provided by Ordinance No. 1322 and the plans and specifications on file in the Office of the City Recorder.

Proposals will be received on either vitrified or cement sewer pipe in accordance with approved plans, specifications and estimate of the City Engineer on file in the office of the City Recorder.

Proposals must be in accordance with printed blanks, which will be furnished on application at the office of the City Recorder. The Sewer must be completed on or before sixty days from the date of the award of the contract by the Council.

Attention is called to Sections 98-102 to 98-106, inclusive, Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated.

No proposal will be considered unless accompanied by a check payable to the City of Cottage Grove, or order, certified by a responsible bank, for an amount equal to ten per cent of the aggregate amount of the proposal, to be forfeited as fixed and liquidated damages should the bidder neglect or refuse to enter into a contract and provide a suitable bond for the faithful performance of the work in the event the contract is awarded to him.

NOTICE OF FILING APPLICATION FOR A CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION OF WATER

Notice is given hereby that the City of Cottage Grove, Oregon has filed an application with Chas. E. Stricklin, State Engineer for approval of a change in point of diversion of water.

Certificate of Water Right recorded at Page 2385, Volume 3, State Record of Water Right Certificates was issued to the City of Cottage Grove confirming a right under Permit No. 30 for the use of 6 cubic feet per second of the waters of Lang Creek, sometimes called Layng Creek, for municipal water supply within the corporate limits of the city of Cottage Grove, with a date of priority of June 12, 1909. The water is conveyed through the city's pipe line, the point of diversion of said pipe line being located 685 feet south of the northwest corner of Section 31, Township 21 South, Range 1 East, W.M.

The city proposes to change the present point of diversion upstream to a point to be located 313.91 feet south and 3,277.04 feet east of the northwest corner of Section 31, Township 21 South, Range 1 East, W.M.

All persons interested are notified hereby that a hearing will be held at the County Court House at Eugene, Oregon, on October 11, 1949 at 8:00 o'clock a.m. All objections to the proposed change, if any there are, will be heard at said time and place. Any objections shall be prepared in writing, one copy to be served on the city of Cottage Grove, Cottage Grove, Oregon, and one copy filed with the State Engineer, Salem, Oregon, together with a \$2 filing fee, at least 10 days prior to the date set for hearing. If no objections are filed, no hearing will be held.

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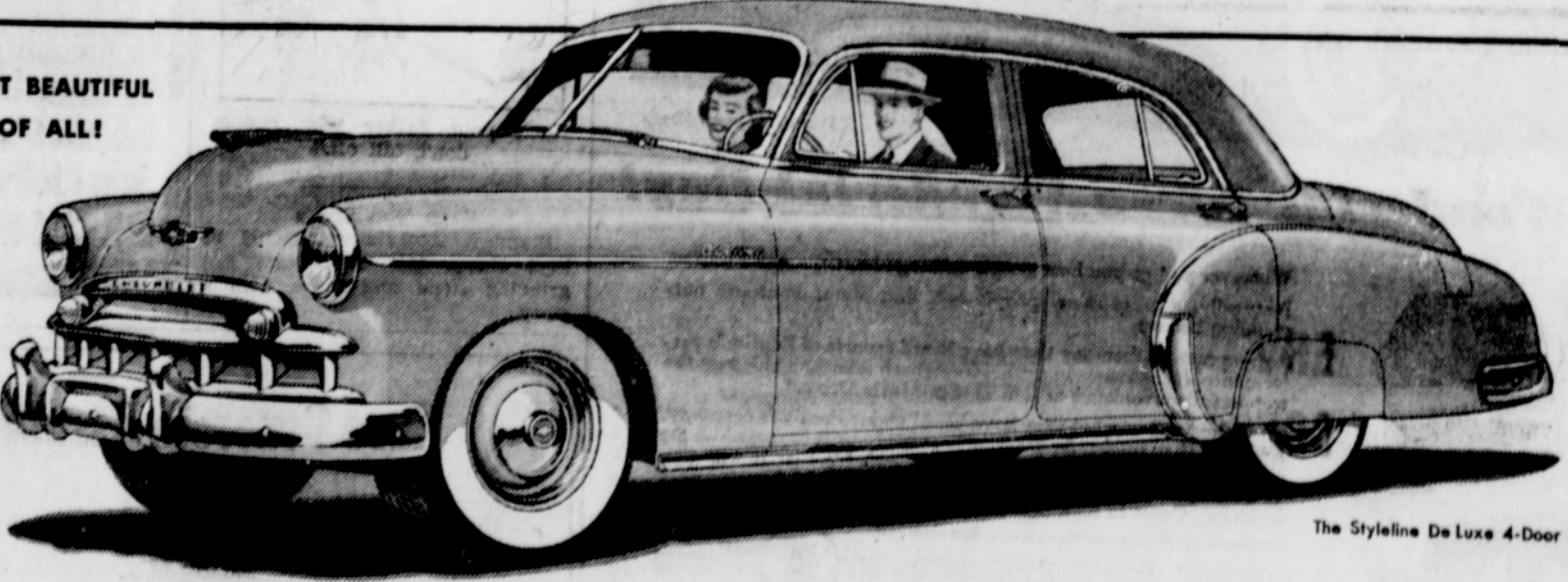
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
