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First Annual Lane Football Jamboree At Civic Stadium in Eugene Sept. 9th

The first annual Lane county football jamboree will be held at the civic stadium in Eugene, September 9 beginning at 8:00 p.m. Four Lane county high schools will participate in the event: Cottage Grove, Junction City, Eugene high school and University high school of Eugene. Each team will be pitted against some other team for two quarters. Each team will draw for an opponent, which means that spectators will witness four quarters of football and will see all four teams in action.

The jamboree is being sponsored by the Exchange Club of Eugene. The proceeds of the sale from programs, advertising and concessions will go to provide an electric timer and scoreboard for the civic stadium. An advanced ticket sale will be made here next week.

Tickets are on sale at the high school, it was learned this noon.

Elmore Roby has the inside track on the open tackle position, but he is getting stiff competition from Richard Chapman and a sophomore, Charles Martin.

Jim Webb seems to have nabbed a backfield job at halfback with Bill McBee, a sophomore at the important ball handling quarterback position. The unexpected appearance of Abe Cruse seems to have solved the right half vacancy left by two-time all star, Bob Summers. Backfield competition is keen with Bob Gasper, Al Martin, Duane Radloff and Wes Malcolm pressing the starting quartette.

Gone from the Lion roster are eight regulars from last year's unbeaten team, the entire backfield of Larry Anderson, Bob Summers, Rollo Bush and Marvin Schaffer graduated. End Harland Mickey and Tackle Bob Rorer also graduated. Gone also is Center Dick Schmitt, who was one of the top linemen in the Up-State All Star versus Portland All Star game. Back to school, but ineligible is Guard Terry Picknell, voted Lane county's top football player of last year.

The Lions get their first action next Friday in the first annual Lane county football jamboree at Eugene when four county teams play two quarters each.

Dove and Pigeon Season Opens On September 1st

Although found mainly in the eastern section of Oregon, the whole state will be open this season to the hunting of doves. The season for doves is September 1 to September 15, both dates inclusive. The bag limit, state-wide, will be 10 in any one day and not more than 10 in possession at any one time.

The season in Oregon this year for band-tailed pigeons will be from September 1 through September 30. In Multnomah, Washington, Clackamas, Yamhill, Polk, Marion, Benton, and Linn counties, and that part of Lane county lying east of the summit of the Coast Range mountains, the limit on band-tails will be 8 in any one day and 8 in possession. Also in these counties there is a season limit of not more than 24 during the entire season. In the remainder of the state the bag limit will be 10 in any one day and not more than 10 in possession at any one time.

The lone KC run came in the second when Harold Wicks circled the bases on two straight errors and a wild pitch. Bunny Potts, of the Elks, drove in one run on his fifth inning triple and scored himself on a Knight error for the McMinnville tallies.
