Medals Available To Veterans of World War Two

Medals honoring various phases of service in World War II, including the European-African-Middle Eastern and the Asiatic-Pacific campaigns, are now available to ex-servicemen or their next of kin, the Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs reported this week.

The Medals, obtainable from the veteran's own branch of service, include the American defence or pre-Pearl Harbor medal, the American theater campaign medal, the victory medal, and the European-African-Middle Eastern and Asiatic-Pacific campaign medals. The marine corps is also issuing the Navy occupation and the China service medals, and the coast guard is issuing the latter, but the Navy doesn't have these yet, officials said.

Former navy, marine and coast guard personnel or next of kin may present their photostatic or certified copies of notice of separation at any Oregon recruiting station and receive their medals at once. Navy stations are located in Portland, Bend, Coos Bay, Roseburg, Grants Pass, Klamath Falls, La Grande, Pendleton, Medford, Salem, Corvallis, The Dalles, Vancouver and Longview. Marine stations are located in Portland, Klamath Falls, Eugene, Salem, Medford and Pendleton. Oregon's only coast guard recruiting office is at 1109 S. W. 5th, Portland.
