## Sabbath School to Give to Hospital

Climaxing a three month's study of medical needs of the two million people living on the banks of rivers in the Amazon River Valley, South America, members of the Cottage Grove Seventh-day Adventist Sabbath school will give a special missions offering Saturday, December 24, to help build a hospital in Belem, Brazil. All of the denomination's Sabbath schools will participate in the project, stated Mrs. E. C. Dye, superintendent of the Sabbath school here.

Reports from the area tell of missionaries dispensing medical medicines from a fleet of mission "clinic" boats to natives along the banks of the forty thousand miles of navigable rivers of the Amazon Valley. Each medical missionary treats from fifteen to twenty thousand people a year. All travel from the mouth of the Amazon to one thousand miles inland is done by boat as there are no roads through the vast swamps, immense forests and steaming jungles.

"People live in huts built on stilts at the shores of rivers swollen by six months of steady rain. Whole villages are often wiped out by malaria. No other place on earth needs medical help more," wrote a missionary to Pastor Walter Blehm, of Cottage Grove. The Adventist mission recently purchased a hospital site in Belem, the Amazon's principle city, 70 miles from the mouth of the river. Here will be built a modest 40-bed, two-story hospital and a separate clinic. It will be used to care for cases needing more than the temporary care the medical launches can give. Native young people will also be trained here to become medical missionaries to their own people.

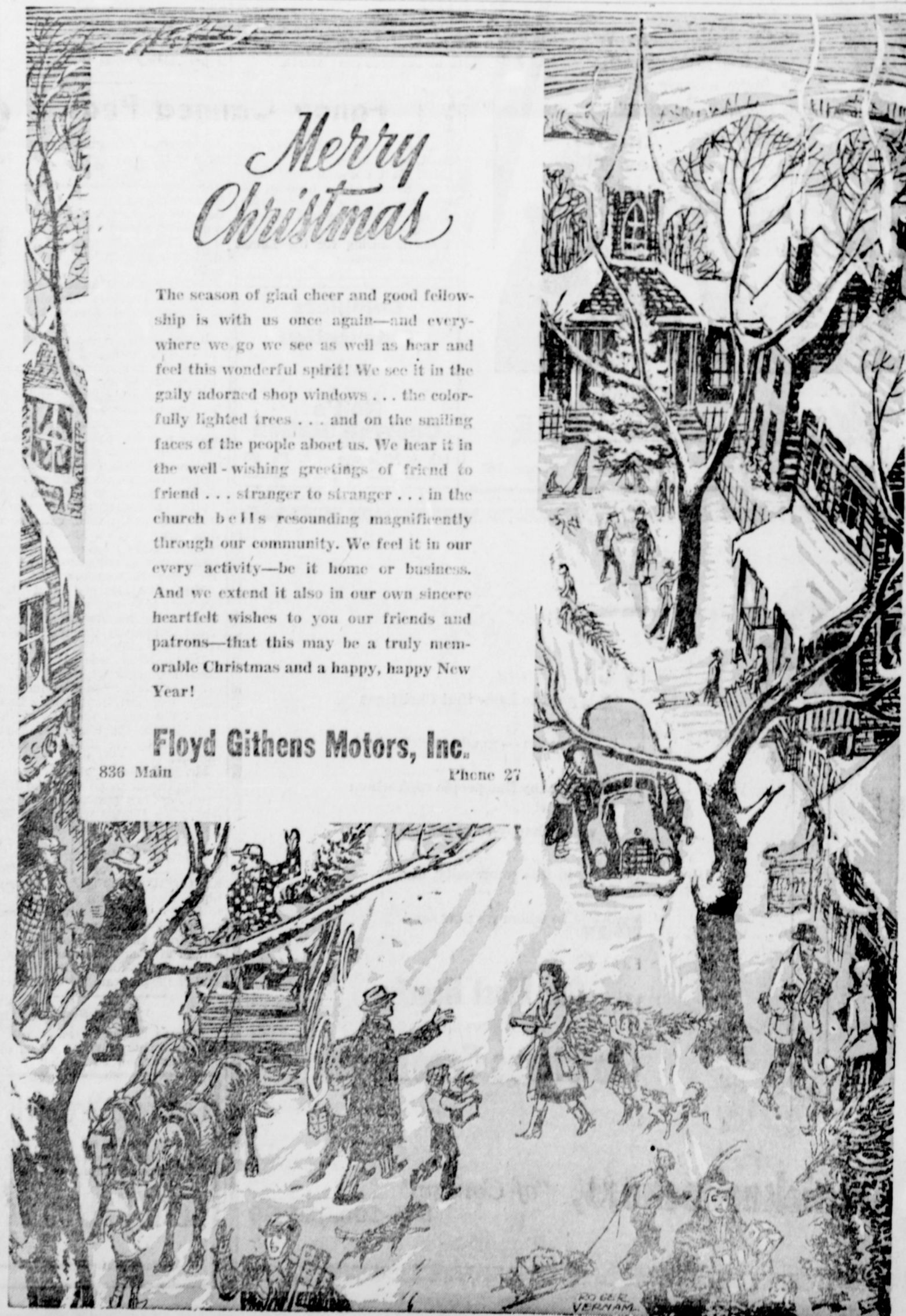
## Merry Christmas
