With Lou Bellissimo hitting a 212 single and 530 series, the Knights of Columbus split 2-2 with Rippy's.

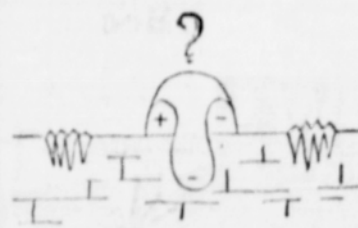
The Cottage Grove Recreation downed the Eagle Cigar Store 3-1. Lihum with a 456 series led the winners. Gates led the losers with a 444 series.

The last game, however, resulted in a protest. In the game Friday night the Lions came out on the short end of a 44-40 count. The Grovers kept in the running until the final whistle and staged a determined rally in the final quarter. They managed to knot the score in the first quarter 14 to 14, but lost a 3 point advantage at the half to trail 22-19. Elmira pulled away 33 to 24 near the end of the fourth quarter when the Lions put on a rally, which fell four points short of tying the score.

Ben Hilliker was high point man for the Grovers with 21 while Skip Mason made 18 for the visitors. In the preliminary game, the Lion B squad defeated the Lorne A squad 30-29 in an overtime contest.
