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Largest Insect Control Program to Be Instituted by Forest Service Soon

The largest insect control operation ever attempted by the Oregon State Board of Forestry will begin in about 60 days when nearly half a million gallons of potent DDT solution will be sprayed on approximately 500 thousand acres of spruce budworm infested forest lands, according to George Spaur, state forester.

The first aerial activity will take place the latter part of May in the Kinzua, Oregon, bug area in Wheeler county, where 160,000 to 180,000 acres of threatened timberlands will be given a bath of the chemical solution.

John B. Woods, Jr., assistant state forester in charge of the big spraying operation, said that bids for aircraft rental and use would be awarded according to the following time schedule. The first bid for aircraft rental will be issued in the very near future, with the remaining bids to be issued thereafter at weekly intervals.

Included in the five tracts to be treated is the 15,000 acre infested area in the Springfield-Roseburg area, which will be treated with the DDT in between the other
