A brief business meeting was held, at which time the club secretary, Elaine Oster, read the following resume of the year's activities: "From Oct. 25, 1949 to Feb. 21, 1950, meetings were held on Tuesday of each week at the home of the leader, Mrs. Wm. F. Norris. At each meeting, a team of two gave demonstrations of a

A candy sale on March 4, held at Brisbane's Electric in Cottage Grove earned the club's contribution towards the 4-H dollar dinner to be demonstrated at the Lane County Fair in September. It has always been necessary for each member who participated in this affair to provide all necessary equipment for the demonstration, but with all clubs contributing funds towards the purchase of necessary kitchen utensils and paraphernalia, it will no longer be such a burden to present a demonstration. The final event of the year is this Achievement Day, with a display of cookies, small cakes and muffins made by the members, as well as the scrapbook of items and pictures of interest taken from the local papers and the 4-H paper "Clover Leaves." Mrs. Melba Heide, county extension agent, and special guest for the evening, spoke briefly on club work and complimented the "Chef's" on their fine report and good work throughout the year. The club scrapbook was presented to Mrs. Norris and guests were invited to sign the register which the members had arranged in the back of the book. A gift of appreciation was also presented to Mrs. Norris. A violin solo by Elaine Oster, a dialogue by Jean Ellen Sherrill, trumpet solo by Jack Durlinger, four chorus numbers by the club, and group singing by all, with a demonstration of the art of making muffins by Elaine and Jean Ellen completed a very enjoyable evening for all.

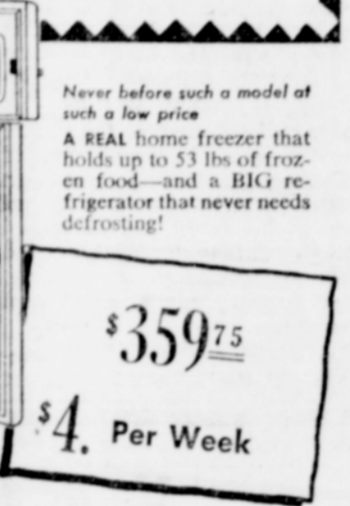
