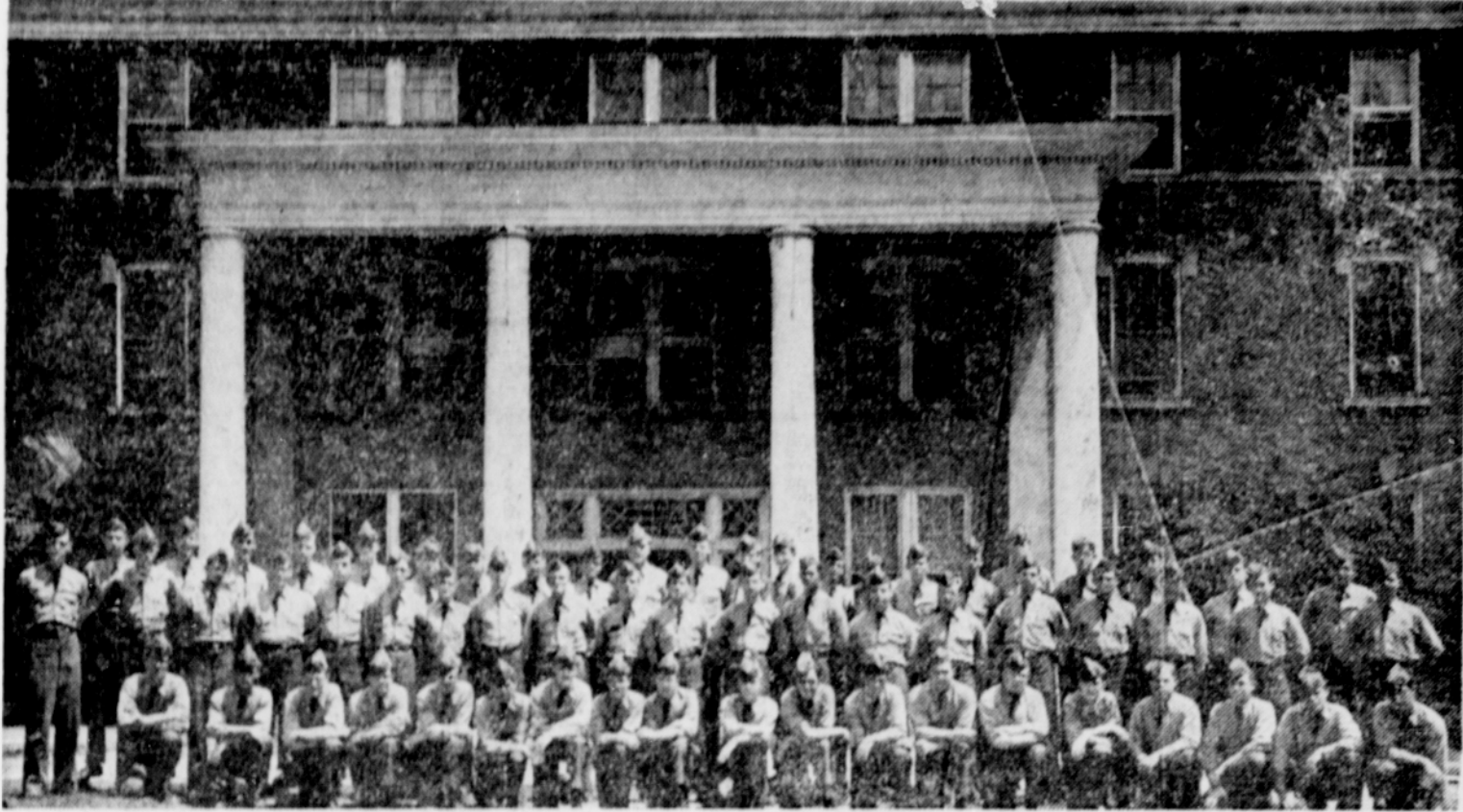

COLISEUM STILL CROWDED FOR OSC COMMENCEMENT

Oregon State College—Even with seats available for 10,000 participants and spectators, the big coliseum here will have to put up the SRO sign for the graduation exercises here Monday, June 5, officials estimate.

After providing each of the graduates with four tickets for relatives, and space for faculty members in the academic procession, only a few seats high above and behind the stage will be left for general spectators without tickets.

Both the baccalaureate service Sunday at 11 o'clock, and the commencement proper, Monday at 10 o'clock, will be broadcast over the state station, KOAC.

Shirley Arne OSC Student Wins Place State Grange Contest

Lois Jane Rollins of Mt. Fannie grange in Union county has been selected Oregon winner in the nationwide essay contest on "Soil Fertility and the Nation's Future," it is announced by Mrs. Beulah Moore, lecturer of the Oregon State grange. The contest is sponsored jointly by the grange and the American Plant Food council.

Bill Johnston of Sunny Valley grange, Josephine county, was second-place winner and Shirley Arne of Dorona grange, Lane county, was third. Miss Arne is a student at Oregon State college.

Cash prizes of \$100, \$50 and \$25 are awarded the state winners, with the state winning essay to be entered for the \$1000 national prize and other awards totaling \$2800.

Judges for the state contest were J. R. Beck, assistant director of extension service, and J. C. Moore, extension conservationist, both of O.S.C., and Robert L. Brown, assistant state conservationist, Soil Conservation service. Seventeen local winners were entered in the state contest. Judging in the national contest will start June 1 by a committee of nationally known men in this field.

OSC REPORTS ON BREEDING OF WESTERN BLACKBERRIES

Breeding new blackberry varieties is a long, scientific and tedious process, but is rewarding to patience and skill, according to a report on this subject issued by the O.S.C. experiment station as written by George F. Waldo, federal horticulturist.

The new bulletin 475, "Breeding Blackberries," is not a popular publication to be used in selecting farm plantings, but is considered exceedingly valuable for those engaged in similar work or who have followed the program carried on at Corvallis since about 1928. The late C. E. Schuster conducted the early exploratory work.

A number of named varieties, such as Cascade and Pacific, and many other unnamed new varieties valuable in breeding have come out of the extensive research.
