Midget Racers To Vie at Co. Fair Grounds June 11th

EUGENE, June 6 — Between 20 and 30 speedburning V-8 and "Offie" midget racing cars will perform on a half-mile dirt track for the first time in Oregon history, when the Oregon Midget Racing Association presents a full schedule of races at the Eugene fairgrounds track here Sunday, June 11. Midgets usually run over a quarter-mile oval.

After his experience here Memorial Day, when only eight of an original field of 18 cars appeared, Jim Harris, promoter of the auto race program here this summer, announced that the midgets have been signed to contracts, like the Oregon Stock Car Association, assuring the Eugene program of at least 20 cars in all future events here. The Big-Car association operated without a contract. Harris also said the fair board had approved treating the entire half-mile track to hold dust to a minimum, instead of only a 20-foot route.

Among the racers to appear here next Sunday will be Louie Sherman of Portland, 1949 champion, and Frank McGowan of Portland, runner-up to Sherman. Other well-known drivers to take part in the full program — including "A" and "B" main events, will be Harold Osborn, Darmond Moore, Shorty Clements, Jack Sack, Bob Nolan, Bud England, Chuck Lantz, Larry Keizer, Frank Cocoran, Len Sutton, Leo Hosk, Bob Porter, Shorty Templeman, and Jim Healy, of Eugene.

Not only are the midgets beautiful and costly machines, but the V-8's and "Offies" possess as much speed as the big cars on a half-mile track where the cars are more maneuverable.

In midget races staged in Portland and Salem this season, the fast cars and daring drivers have shown before capacity crowds.

Sunday's races will be the second of a series of eight scheduled here this season, although the two other big-car events may be cancelled — unless a contract is signed to assure fans of an entry of at least 15 working cars.

Commission Initiates Youth Wildlife Setup

"An educational wildlife conservation program designed for youth summer camps and prepared by the Oregon State Game Commission will begin Friday, June 2, 1950, at the Tillamook County 4-H camp. This is the first in a series of appearances by members of the information and education department of the game commission scheduled by 4-H, Boy Scout, Girl Scout, Campfire Girl, and denominational summer camps.

Austin Hamer, game commission education agent, who organized the program, will conduct the wildlife sessions at most of the camps. The wildlife education program was first arranged for 4-H camps with the assistance of Burton Hutton and Cal Monroe, 4-H club agents at Oregon State college. It is a flexible program, adaptable for all youth groups, stated Hamer.

A two-day itinerary consisting of lecture periods, field trips, and moving pictures has been slated for each of the participating youth camps. The identification of characteristic Oregon game birds, furbearers, and fish will be illustrated by means of slides, mounted specimens and pelts. The habits of various wild creatures, their management, and their value to man will be discussed. Sportsmanship, firearm safety, and woodsmanhood will also be stressed by the wildlife agent. Field trips to observe wild animals and their food and cover requirements will be conducted on a voluntary basis.
