**Excise Tax Cut Prospect Slim**

WASHINGTON, Doubt settled deeper on capitol hill Tuesday that there will be any excise tax cutting this year at all.

This is the situation: 1. The House Ways and Means committee has approved slashes it estimated at \$1,130,000 — almost twice the \$655,000,000 limit President Truman proposed — for furs, jewelry, luggage, toilet preparations, movie tickets, stoves, tires, tubes, baby bottle warmers and scores of other items.

2. Mr. Truman has informed Congress he will veto any bill that cuts the excises and fails to make up the revenue by higher taxes in other directions.

3. The ways and Means committee is balking at the President's suggestion that \$650,000,000 in additional taxes be slapped on corporation income, to help cover the excise losses. Even if the committee approves a corporated boost, there is doubt that it ever will get through the Senate.

4. Time is running out.

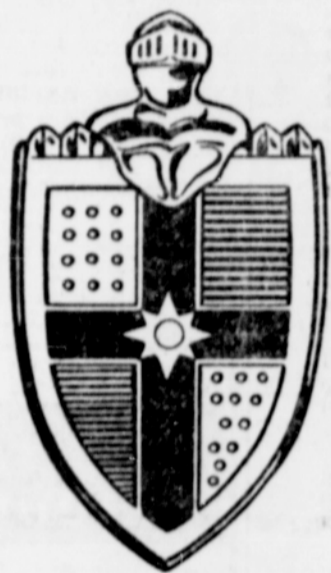
