New Type Work Dresses Feature Of Women's Meet

Assembled for the eighteenth meeting of the Oregon Home Economics Extension council at O.S.C., June 1 and 2, 152 women learned how to select functional dresses with sleeve designs ensuring comfort while accomplishing household tasks.

A style review showing work dresses appropriate for the short, medium and tall mature figure was the result of a year's research carried on by Mrs. Clara Edaburn, O.S.C. clothing instructor. Set-in sleeves were shown which are more action-free. Three were shown: one with a pleat on top; two, a snapped or buttoned split on top; three, an overlapping top.

After studying every day motions made by homemakers, Mrs. Edaburn designed an even or shaped bias insert which could be used on the under-arm seam after cutting blouse side seams down. Sleeves and yoke cut in one also give homemakers ease in arm reaching as the bias gave instead of binding.

A total of \$10,119.28 was collected this year for Azalea house, home economics cooperative house, Multnomah county with \$3641 and Lane county with \$3019 made the highest contributions. The building fund now stands at \$35,119.28. A goal of \$10,000 for 1951 to be contributed by the 13,000 unit members in the state will complete the fund it was reported.

Virginia Carlson, home agent, Lane county, reported that laundry facilities, dining and living rooms and recreation rooms are most needed by girls living in cooperative houses. Miss Carlson is compiling the research for Azalea house plans.
