Albany Prepares For Timber Carnival

Albany (Special)—World championship titles, fame, and \$3,000 in cash and prizes will be at stake here in the sixth annual running of the thrilling and spectacular logging events that make up the core of the Timber Carnival, July 2-3-4.

With interest of Pacific Northwest loggers at the highest level in the history of the show, entries are being received daily from California, Washington and Oregon logging camps, and men from the Baikie Bros. Logging Co., Ltd., Campbell River, B. C., have also signed up.

The following schedule of awards has been announced: World championship speed climbing, first place, \$225; second, \$100; third, \$50; fourth, \$25. Fifth and sixth places in all events will be merchandise awards, which this year include power saw and other loggers' equipment and clothing.

Rotating trophies that must be won three times in succession for permanent possession, will continue to circulate as in the past, and smaller permanent trophies will be awarded also to first place winners.

All prizes are awarded on the final day of the contests, July 4, by the Timber Carnival queen.

Two OSC Farms Named to Honor Former Leaders

Two of the experimental farms at O.S.C. agricultural experiment station have been officially named in honor of former department heads who were active in

the early development of the station's research program.

The agronomy farm located at Granger has been named the "George R. Hyslop farm" for the man who was head of the farm crops department from 1916 until his death in July 1943. Hyslop, who was cited as the man "who has probably contributed more to the welfare of Oregon agriculture than any other person," first joined the college staff in 1908. He played a tremendous role in

the development of field, forage and seed crop industries in the state.

The horticultural farm, known as the Milhollen farm, has been named the "Lewis-Brown Horticultural farm" for C. I. Lewis, head of the department from 1907 until 1919, and W. S. Brown, head from 1920 until his death in 1942. It was largely through the efforts of Brown that the farm was acquired for experimental work.

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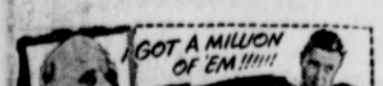

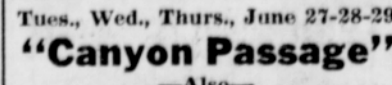
