## Mountain Goats Seen in Wallowas

Four and possibly a fifth mountain goat have been sighted high on a mountain near Wallowa Lake in Northeastern Oregon by Mike McFetridge, Wallowa Lake packer, and Ted Laughlin, Game Commission field agent.

According to Laughlin, the goats were scattered on sheer rock formations at 7,000 feet altitude. The animals were observed through field glasses but swirling clouds and rough terrain prevented a close approach.

The five goats were last seen in March when released by game agents on the slopes of Chief Joseph Mountain which rises above Wallowa Lake. Prior to this introduction, mountain goats were unknown in Oregon.

The Oregon State Game Commission has permission to trap nineteen more of the shaggy cliff dwellers in Northern Washington sometime next winter. These animals will be used to supplement the Wallowa band.

## Antelope Hunters Apply for Tags

Although hunting regulations will not be made final until July 28, applications for antelope tags are now available at all Game Commission license agencies.

The applications are being made available early due to the fact that the date for the setting of hunting regulations falls so late this year and the fact that if an antelope season is held, it would fall in August. Tentative plans call for a limited season, August 19 to August 25, both dates inclusive.

Those wishing to hunt antelope should secure applications at license agencies, complete them and mail them to the Game Commission office in Portland as soon as possible. No money should be sent with the application.

Census information shows a modest increase in antelope numbers and the possibility of a limited season on bucks only appears to be good.

Just Fishin'

Reports from fishermen this week are much more encouraging. Many are coming home with limit and near-limit catches.

Johnny Trunnell went down to the North Umpqua last weekend and got his limit using a spinning outfit and worms. Ben Hilliker reports that they're biting nicely on flies in the Row river. Conditions are getting good on the McKenzie where Jack Miller caught a sizeable bunch last week.

Crescent creek and Big Marsh are good on mosquito and worms.

In te bay, salmon are going for plugs and pilchers. Winnipeg lake is also producing fine catches, with reports of trout from 8 to 10 inches in length. You'll find Mosby creek below Stewart White bridge pretty good if you use clusters and single egg bait.

Here's the roundup of conditions in the state:

**Coastal Section**  
 Trout fishing is improving in the north coastal streams. Some Jack salmon are now being taken. Bay fishing has slumped but blue backs are being taken off shore. Favorable catches have been reported in the North Fork and the Main Fork of the Nehalem river. Salmon angling should pick up in the next few weeks.

**Southern Oregon**  
 Catches of trout in the main Rogue river are good to excellent. The water is falling and clear. Good catches have been made on gray hackle and bucktail coachman. Single eggs are producing good catches in the Prospect-Union creek area. In the Upper Umpqua, water conditions and trout fishing are excellent. Various wet flies are producing well.

**Willamette Valley**  
 Water conditions are excellent throughout the McKenzie area. Fishing on the McKenzie has improved and Blue River and South Fork are producing a number of good catches. Trout in the Upper Willamette are being taken on spinners, eggs, worms, and flies—bucktail caddis, March brown and beetle bug patterns are best. Good catches of Mackinaw and Dolly Varden are reported from Odell lake. Gold lake was closed July 10.

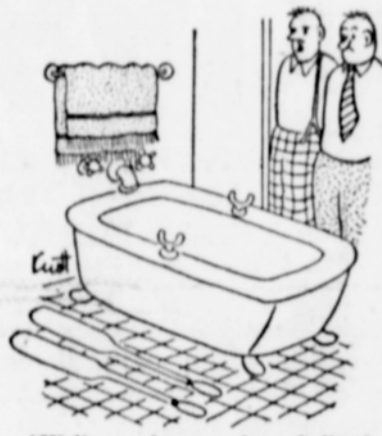

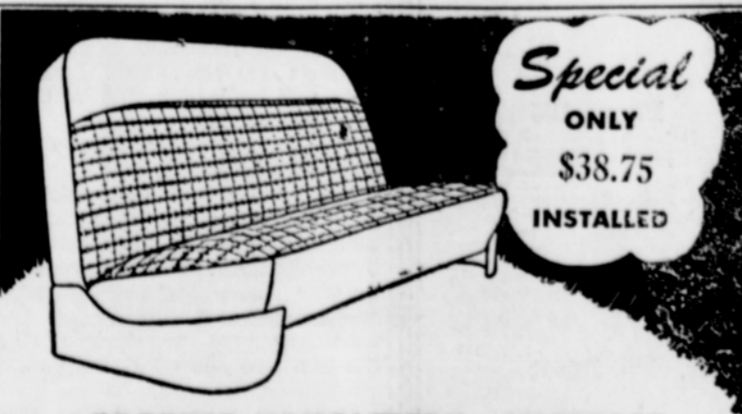
