Tibbs Maxey Will Speak Sunday at Church of Christ

Tibbs Maxey, president of the College of the Scriptures, Louisville, Kentucky will be the morning speaker at the Church of Christ, 6th and Gibbs, Sunday, July 16th.

The College of the Scriptures is a college for Negro students. It was opened in September 1945 as the only negro seminary of the Church of Christ and is supported from free will gifts from those desiring to help with the work of training young negro men and women in the true faith "Once for all delivered to the saints." The College of the Scriptures is a four year seminary offering the degree of B.S.L. and A.B. and recognized by the Veterans Administration and eight colleges of the Restoration movement.

"Life" is the subject of the lesson-sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, Sunday, July 16. The golden text is, "The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the strength of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?" (Ps. 27:1).

Among the citations which comprise the lesson-sermon is the following from the Bible: "Blessed are they that do his commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city." Free Methodist Church Is Adding Sun. School Rooms

The increase in attendance at the Free Methodist Sunday school and church has made it necessary to build additional rooms to the present building at 915 South Sixth street. The addition, which is 32x36, and three stories high is being constructed at the rear of the present building, and will be finished in stucco as is the exterior of the church.

The main floor will be used for dining room and kitchen, and will have cement floor; the second floor will house five large Sunday school rooms and the third story has two large Sunday school rooms. The building will be heated with oil.

The addition is valued at approximately \$10,000 with all labor so far being donated and most of the material has been contributed. It is planned to have the new addition ready for occupancy by September. The Rev. C. B. Starkey is pastor of the local church.

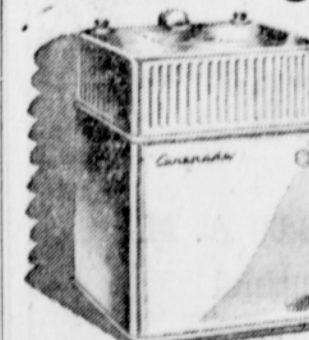
