

Richard Smith To Be Ordained in Local Church 18th

Richard Knox Smith, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joe T. Smith, 324 Adams Ave., will be ordained into the ministry of the Presbyterian church on Tuesday evening, July 18, in a service to be held in the First Presbyterian church. The service has been arranged by the Presbytery of Willamette, which in the Presbyterian system, alone has authority to ordain men into the ministry. The Moderator of Willamette Presbytery, the Rev. Allan B. Philp of Bend will preside and ask the Constitutional questions. The sermon will be preached by the Rev. Chester W. Hamblin, D. D., of the First Presbyterian Church of Salem, and the Ordination Prayer will be given by the Reverend Professor Ernest W. Warrington, Ph.D., of the Department of Religion at Oregon State College. Others taking part will be the Rev. James Aiken Smith, D. D., of Portland, former pastor of the Cottage Grove Presbyterian church; the Rev. Robert Bulkeley of Corvallis; and the Rev. Hugh Peniston, who will give the charge to the pastor.

will meet in the afternoon to examine Mr. Smith in preparation for the ordination service. At 6:30 all members and friends are invited to a fellowship dinner (covered dish) at the church. The service of ordination is at 8 o'clock and is open to the public.

Mr. Smith is a graduate of the Cottage Grove union high school, and Oregon State college. He has just graduated from the Divinity School of Yale University in New Haven, Connecticut. He and his wife, Harriet, are expected here by the end of this week. Mr. Smith has accepted a call to the First Presbyterian church in Ephrata, Washington.

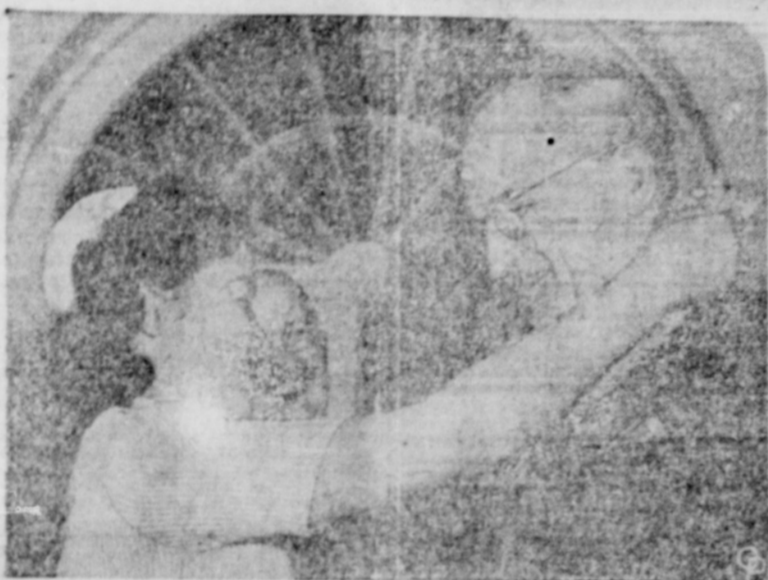

Apple Graham Pudding
3/4 cup graham cracker crumbs
2 teaspoons soft butter or margarine
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
1 package vanilla pudding powder
1 cup Fat Milk
1 cup water
1 cup evaporated apple sauce, cooked or canned

Mix crumbs with butter and cinnamon. Put pudding powder into saucepan. Stir in slowly mixture of milk and water. Heat to boiling, stirring all the time. Cook slowly and stir 30 seconds. Remove from heat; add applesauce. Put into 4 dessert dishes. Top with crumb mixture. Keep chilled until serving time.
