Just Fishin'



Several limit catches were reported this week as fishing conditions show general improvement in the rivers and streams.

Margaret Clearwater, Farney Edwards, and Ben Hilliker caught their limits at East lake, while Tommy Jones and party got near-limits during four days at the same place. They report that East lake is being fished heavily, but quite a few are being hooked.

In the bay, anglers have been catching a few salmon. Bob Dusenberry and his brother caught four silvers this week which came to 14 pounds when dressed down.

Mosby creek is good from the side camp to the mouth, while the Row river is pretty spotty. Brice and Layng creeks should be good this weekend since the water is low now.

South Fork of the McKenzie is excellent. The water is just right and hatches are raising. Loren Carver caught one 21 inches long on a small caddis.

Roads to Taylor Burn and Waldo lake are open now. Fishermen can get in to Three Creek lake

from Sisters. Little Deschutes has been good lately, but seems to be tapering off now.

Coastal Section

A few sea-run cutthroat or blueback are entering the central coastal streams but trout angling is still slow. A few salmon are in Winchester Bay but most of the fish are being caught outside the bar. Striped bass fishing on Coos Bay is slow. A few small bass are being taken on the Millacoma and Coos river. Bass, perch, and bluegill fishing is excellent in most of the coastal lakes.

Southern Oregon

Trout fishing and water conditions are excellent in the Upper Umpqua area, including Little river and upper South river. Steelhead migration is strong and catches are just beginning. Anglers are urged to report any tagged trout.

Some limit catches of large rainbow continue to be made in Diamond lake. Whitefish lure are getting good results and bucktail coachman flies fished in the late evening have been good producers.

Willamette Valley

Bass fishing continues to improve on the lakes and sloughs. The Luckimute river has been a good trout producer on small gray flies. Parties fishing deep in the Yamhill have done well.

Water conditions are excellent throughout the McKenzie area, and fishing on the main river has been excellent. South Fork and Blue river are also good.

Ex-Navy Men With Dependents May Now Re-Enlist

Ex-Navy men who are eligible to re-enlist in the grade of Seaman or higher may now re-enlist in the U.S. Navy even though they have dependents. This word was received from the local U. S. Navy Recruiting station at Eugene, this week. Also men who were discharged from the Navy under the Saved Pay provision of the new Pay Bill, or were discharged by reason of dependency may now re-enlist.

The Navy is also asking for the Naval Reservist in the general and emergency ratings of Petty Officer First Class and below to volunteer for a minimum of six months duty and will guarantee them twelve months duty if they so desire. Chief Petty Officers in the ratings of SQ, ET, AC, MN, RD, FT, CT, PH, FC, AT, and YM are also being asked to volunteer for duty under the same provisions.
