Model of Trail Pageant Stage



THE 500-FOOT OUTDOOR stage for the 1950 Oregon Trail Pageant will look something like the model above when finished. The two 50-foot revolving stages can be seen in the center, with the Three Sisters rising behind them. The towers at the sides will be used by the narrators and for much of the action. In front of the stages there will be a good sized man-made lake with a water curtain which will be used between scenes. The pageant will be at the Lane county fairgrounds, July 26-29. All performances are identical.

Sawmill Operators To Confer Next Month In Portland

The first sawmill operating conference in the West to be held since the 1930's is scheduled for August 21-22 at the Multnomah Hotel in Portland, Oregon. Three major regions of the western lumber industry will be represented, including the pine, redwood and Douglas fir areas.

The meeting is being organized and sponsored by The Timberman, an international lumber journal published in Portland, at the request of a large segment of the entire western lumber industry.

The two-day session will be strictly business sessions with intensive work devoted to operating problems with the view of improving the standards of lumber manufacture in the West.

A 20-man industry advisory committee made up of sawmill men from all regions of the West is assisting in mapping out the program. Main topics of discussion will include all phases of lumber manufacture, grades improvement, mechanical problems, maintenance, types of saws and their proper uses, mill layout, utilization, equipment and many other important subjects essential to bring out better manufacture.

There will be no registration fee for the meeting and no machinery show or extra activities are planned. Both sawmill men and equipment manufacturers' representatives are invited to attend the sessions.

OSC Cyclotron For Atomic Study Being Installed

Oregon State College—Construction of Oregon State's cyclotron is progressing rapidly this summer, although it will be several months or even a year before it will be completed because of a shortage of funds, according to Dr. E. A. Yunker, head of the O.S.C. physics department.

The large steel magnet and pole faces, weighing approximately 50 tons, are in place. The cyclotron itself is surrounded by a concrete wall 30 inches thick to halt any harmful rays. The wall is made of 1700-pound concrete blocks given to the college by the Consolidated Builders of Portland.

A 40 by 60 foot Butler-type building will house the cyclotron, which is located a short distance southwest of the new college coliseum.

Steel for the magnet was made available to Oregon State college without cost by the atomic energy commission after it had been discarded as worthless except for magnet purposes. It originally had been used for an experimental magnet at the University of California.

Dr. R. R. Dempster and Dr. J. J. Brady, nuclear physicists at O.S.C. estimate total cost of the Oregon State cyclotron will be less than \$50,000 only a fraction of the market price of a similar machine.

When completed, the cyclotron will be used for research and for training graduate students in techniques of nuclear physics. It will also insure a steady supply of radio isotopes needed in many fields of related research, such as biology, chemistry and medical studies.

Speed Accounts In Highway Death

Ten people have died on Oregon streets and highways according to reports received so far this month, the State Traffic Safety Division said Friday.

With the month only half gone and the vacation congestion reaching its height, the Division warned that the month's death toll will be far greater if motorists do not keep their speed down.

The Division pointed out that at 70 miles per hour and higher, every other accident causes a death. As the speed goes down the

motorist's chances of surviving an accident increase. At 30 to 40 miles per hour, there is only one fatal accident in 98.

Proof that speed is the killer is established by the fact that last year 78 per cent of all fatal accidents occurred on the open roads, outside cities. The largest portion of these deaths were the result of high speed. Passing another vehicle without sufficient clearance was a major contributing factor, the Division concluded.

Most People Take Vacation Trips During Summer

Recent surveys have shown approximately 50 per cent of all vacation trips taken by American families are taken during the months of June, July and August, the Oregon State Motor Association reports.

Following closely on this period is autumn with 26 per cent; spring with 12.5 per cent and winter with 11 per cent.

Surveys of American vacation

habits indicate people of this nation spend seven billion dollars annually on their vacation trips. Oregon's share of this "tourist take" in 1949 was \$110,000,000.

Forty-one per cent of the tourists' expenditures go for food and lodging which, in Oregon, in 1949, meant a total of \$45,650,000 spent for this purpose.

Seventy-nine per cent of the vacationing Americans travel by private automobile and they travel an average of 928 miles per trip, spending \$969,300,000 for gasoline, oil and automobile accessories.
