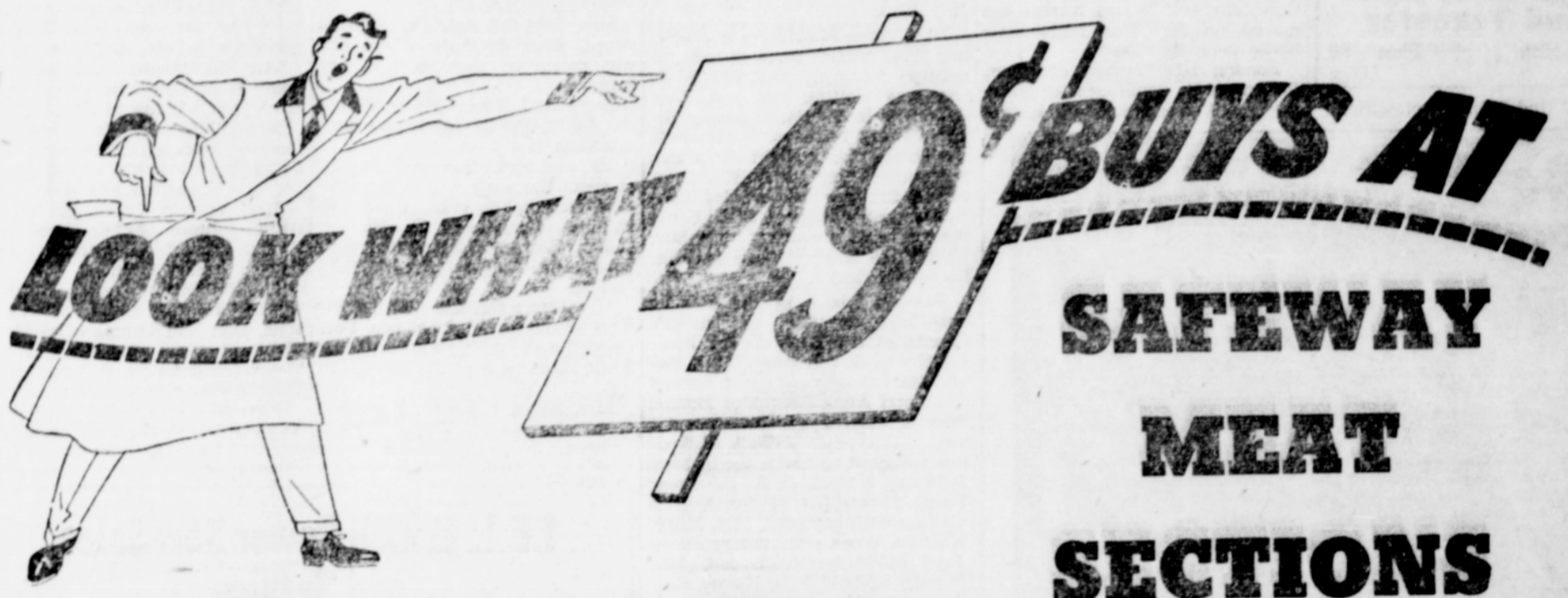
Francis Youngblood started to pick cherries near Creswell Monday.
