Z. E. MERRILL RESIGNS AS PRESIDENT OF MT. STATES POWER CO.

The resignation of Z. E. Merrill as president of Mountain States Power Company and his election as chairman of the board of that company, together with the election of A. W. Trimble as president, were announced from Albany, Oregon today. The effective date will be August 1, 1950.

Mr. Merrill has served the company for 27 years in various capacities including assistant general manager, vice president, director and president. He was elected to the latter office in December 1937. Reasons of personal health are attributed to his desire to be relieved of the strenuous duties as president of the corporation. As chairman of the board it is expected he will be chiefly concerned with matters pertaining to financing and other affairs requiring consideration by the directors, although he will also be available for consultation on all matters pertaining to the Company.

Mr. Trimble, who will succeed Mr. Merrill as president, has been associated with Mountain States Power Company since 1930 when he became a member of the accounting staff. He served a number of years as assistant treasurer and from 1942 to 1949 was president and treasurer. In 1949 he was made executive vice president and is now serving in that capacity. He has been a director of the company since 1945.

Both men are residents of Albany, Oregon.
