Legion Playoffs To Be Held In Drain For Southern Oregon Baseball Crown

Playoffs for the Southern Oregon Junior Legion baseball championship will take place in Drain this weekend with doubleheaders every evening.

Friday night games will pit Albany District three champion, against Sutherlin, which came out on top in the Douglas county junior league. The second game will see Medford and Bandon teams battle it out. They are the champs of Districts four and ten, respectively. The first game will begin at 6:30 p.m.

Saturday competition will feature winners vs. winners and losers vs. losers of Friday games. The game between the two losers will get under way at 6:30 p.m.

There will be two more games

Sunday, one at 2:30 p.m. and the other at 8 p.m. The evening game will determine the championship of southern Oregon and the right to vie for the state championship the weekend of Aug. 12-13 at Albany.

Neither Cottage Grove nor Drain junior legion teams will participate in the southern Oregon playoffs. Both teams were co-sponsored by Floyd Githens Motor Co. and the American Legion.

Baseball Training Camp To Be Held In Dallas Aug. 4, 5

DALLAS, Oregon—Mickey Shader, western scout for the New York Giants National league baseball club, has issued a call for diamond talent to report to a tryout camp in this little Willamette valley city on August 4 and 5.

With Hughie Day, another Giant scout, Shader will look over prospects for the Giants as he conducts the camp "in major league style."

Several players were sent to farm clubs from the camp held here last summer, first to be held in Dallas.

All players eligible to sign professional contracts may attend without charge, although each must pay his own expenses and bring his own uniform. Games will be played both Friday and Saturday, and all players will be allowed to participate.

In Dallas, camp will be held on the high school field with sessions beginning at 10 a.m. Day, a Dallas resident, is now accepting applications from those who wish to participate, but advance registration is not necessary. Shader points out that the camp will be strictly a hunt for talent and is not a baseball school, although much instruction will be given. Sessions will be held rain or shine, and on the concluding day, pick of the prospects will meet a top semi-pro outfit of this area in a nine-inning game.

Shader, in his 39th year in baseball, states that anyone signed to the Giants or any of the 19 farm clubs will have full expenses refunded. Carl Hubbell, director of the farm system for the Giants, considers Oregon a rich field for development of ball players, Shader declares.
