Sealed Proposals for the construction of a sanitary interceptor sewer addressed to the City Council of Cottage Grove, Cottage Grove, Oregon, and endorsed "Proposal for Sanitary Interceptor Sewer Construction" will be received at the office of the City Council, City Hall, Cottage Grove, Oregon, until 8:00 P.M. Pacific Daylight Saving Time on the 21st day of August, 1950, and then will be publicly opened and read.

This work consists of approximately 4900 lineal feet of sanitary sewer 27" in size together with the necessary manholes, other appurtenances, pavement removal and replacement, and other miscellaneous items.

A copy of said Specifications, Plans, Information and Forms may be obtained at the above office upon deposit of \$15.00. Bidders must be prequalified in accordance with the laws of Oregon.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish security for faithful performance of the Contract in the full amount of the contract price.

Oral auction bids will be received by the Regional Forester or his authorized representative at the office of the Forest Supervisor, Post Office Building, Roseburg, Oregon, beginning at 2:00 p.m. Pacific daylight saving time, September 12, 1950, for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting, and all merchantable dead timber located on an area embracing about 223 acres within sections 20, 21, 28 and 29, T. 21 S., R. 1 E., W.M., surveyed, Umpqua National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 9,800,000 feet B. M., more or less, of Douglas-fir, sugar pine and western white pine, 300,000 feet B.M., more or less, of Western redcedar and incense-cedar, 1,750,000 feet B.M., more or less, of Western hemlock and other species of sawtimber. Sealed bids accompanied by required payment received by the Forest Supervisor prior to 2:00 p.m., September 12, 1950, will be considered the equivalent of an oral bid and posted for the information of all bidders. No bid of less than \$13.00 per M feet for Douglas-fir, sugar pine and western white pine, \$2.60 per M feet for western redcedar and incense-cedar, and \$2.75 per M feet for western hemlock and other species will be considered. In addition to the prices bid for stumpage, a co-operative deposit of \$0.05 per M feet B.M., to be used by the Forest Service for partially paying the cost of slash disposal, and a co-operative deposit of .35 per M feet B.M., to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over, for a total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement will be required. \$20,000.00 to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to the conditions of sale, must accompany each sealed bid and must be shown to be in the possession of oral bidders as a qualification for auction bidding. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately make the required payment and confirm.

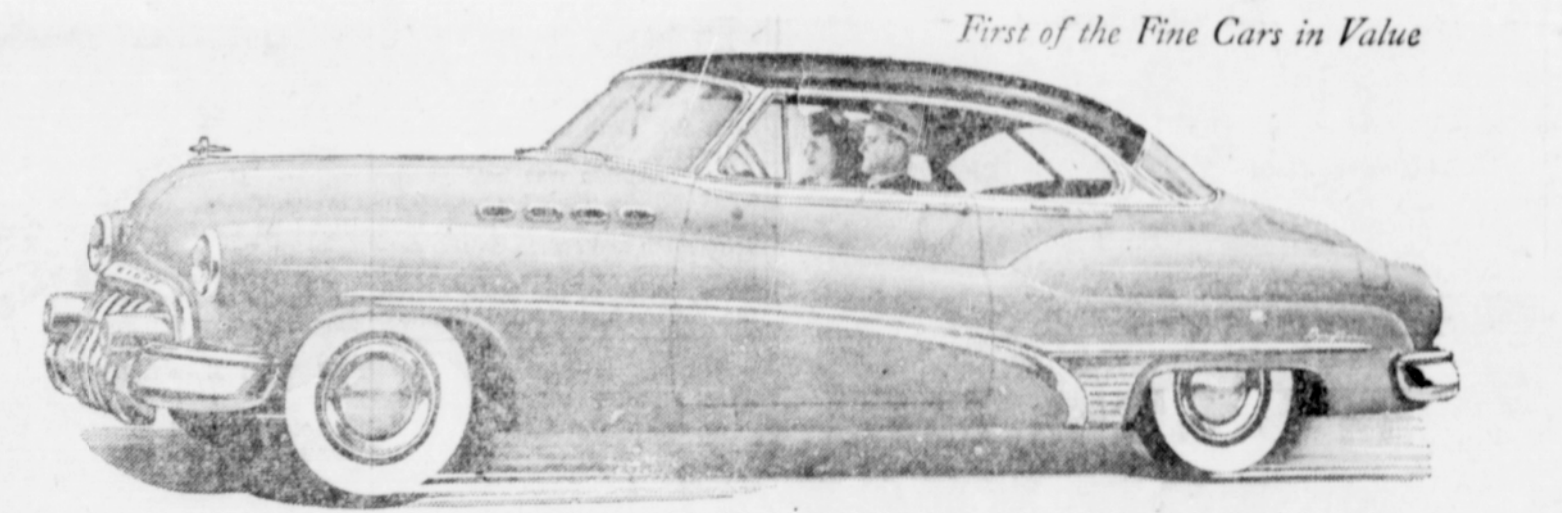
