WHEREAS, the unregulated use of certain forest areas is, in my judgement, a menace to life and property on account of an excessive amount of inflammable debris on the ground, and WHEREAS, upon the showing of the State Forester, it appears to me to be necessary to close to unregulated use the following areas within and adjacent to the Umpqua National Forest, designated as: Area No. 74-P (ADAMS CREEK AREA) That part of Section 7 lying south of the Brice Creek Road, Sections 17, 18 and 21, T. 22S., R. 1E., and AREA NO. 108-P (LAYING CREEK AREA) All of T. 21S., R. 1E., except Sections 1 and 31. Permits to enter the above-described areas may be obtained at Laying

Religious Education Week Scheduled For Sept. 24-Oct. 1

Chicago—46,000,000 Protestants in the United States and Canada are called on to observe Religious Education Week, September 24-October 1, with the theme "Religious Teaching—Vital to the Nation."

Dr. Roy G. Ross, general secretary of the International Council of Religious Education, which sponsors the observance, issued the call. The I.C.R.E. represents 40 major Protestant denominations and more than 800 state and community councils of churches.

The need for greater efforts in religious teaching was cited by Dr. Ross in his call: "At the mid-point of the century we have been reminded of the spiritual resources of our nations (United States and Canada). A century and a half ago, though small in numbers and poor in resources, we were rich in faith and spiritual idealism. Today we are as giants among the nations of the earth. It is not clear, however, that we have grown comparably in religious faith and in the things of the spirit."

Creek Ranger Station, NOW, THEREFORE, I, Douglas McKay, Governor of the State of Oregon, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the provisions of Section 107-210, Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated, as amended by Chapter 252, Oregon Laws, 1945 do hereby proclaim the unregulated use of the above-described areas to be unlawful and that said areas shall be subject to entry only through permit to be issued by the State Forester, or a fire warden, under which permit entrant shall comply with any and all of the following requirements: (1) To refrain from smoking except in places designated as safe in said permit. (2) To build no open fires except in places designated as safe in said permit. (3) To have as a part of his or her equipment when using campfires, except when traveling as a pedestrian and/or carrying an improved, designated and tested campgrounds, tools as specified by the forester suitable for extinguishing fires. This proclamation shall be effective from and after the eighth day of August, 1950, and shall remain in full force and effective until and including the 31st day of December, 1950. Done at the Capitol in Salem, Oregon, this seventh day of August, 1950.

THE BIBLE SPEAKS:

"II Timothy 2:15 "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."

The Bible comes to us with natural divisions in it. It is as normal to recognize sections or divisions of the Bible as it is for our children to see it in their grammar, math or geography. The geography book has a map of the world on its opening pages. The map shows two major divisions; the western and eastern hemispheres. Each hemisphere is subdivided. The Western has two continents in it; North America and South America. Each continent is divided; Alaska, Canada, United States, Mexico, etc. Let's look at the Bible. It comes to us with two major divisions; Old Testament and New Testament. Each Testament is subdivided. You find history, law, prophecy and poetry in the Old Testament. The New Testament gives us biography, history, epistles and prophecy.

Paul said, "rightly divide the word of truth." Confusion comes to most people when they read the Bible because they try to make applications from both the Old and New Testaments to themselves. Had you stopped to think why one Testament is called "old"? No city, state or nation ever lived under two constitutions or set of laws at the same time. Still, you have tried to conform your life according to the two constitutions of the Bible. Hear Paul, "Then said he, Lo, I come to do thy will, O God. He taketh away the first, that he may establish the second." Paul said the first one was taken away. Hence, the law that circumscribes Christian people today is the New Testament, the law of Christ.
