1950 Waterfowl Season Will Last 55 Days in Oregon

Rules for the 1950 waterfowl season as set by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife service provide for a straight 55-day season in Oregon which will run concurrently with the duck seasons in Washington and Idaho.

The season for the three north-west states begins at 12 noon November 3 and extends through December 27. California is still split—October 20 to November 10 and December 15 to January 5.

"Following last year's season, our sportsmen strongly urged that a continuous season paralleling those in our neighboring states be set," stated Charles Lockwood, Oregon state game director. "Although we asked for a 60-day straight season," continued Lockwood, "I feel that this year our shooters will have a much more satisfactory duck season."

The daily bag and possession limit for the Pacific flyway is six ducks, an increase of one in the daily limit and a decrease of four in the possession limit of last year. Only one wood duck may be included in the bag or possession limit.

The limit for geese is the same as last year—six a day or in possession in any combination not exceeding two of Canada geese or its subspecies, white-fronted geese or brant. This means the bag limit may include six geese provided at least four are snow geese. As usual, the rare Ross's goose is protected.

With the exception of the 12 noon opening, the shooting hours are from one-half hour before sunrise to one hour before sunset.

Just Fishin'



Encouraging reports on good trout catches have been coming from anglers fishing the Willamette river between the mouths of the Santiam and McKenzie rivers. The bucktail coachman cast in the riffles has produced the best results.

In the upper Willamette area—on the middle fork and its tributaries—numerous good catches have been reported but the fish have been taken on dry flies in the late evening. With continued hot, dry weather causing a general lowering of the stream levels, prospects are not encouraging.

For fishermen with a liking for "packing in," lakes in the Willamette Pass area such as Bobby and Rosemary lakes have been offering excellent rewards.

The McKenzie and its tributaries have been fair. Dry fly fishermen have been taking fish in the evenings.

Coastal Section
Good catches of chinook are being made at the mouth of the Columbia. Good salmon catches have been made at the mouth of the Rogue. Silvers are being taken at Winchester bay and the fishing is fair. Off shore salmon fishing continues good throughout the coastal area.

Blueback fishing continues good on many coastal streams. Nice catches have been made on the Wilson, Trask, and Nehalem rivers in tidewater. Good blueback catches are also reported from the Alsea, and some jacks and chinook are being taken from the lower river.

Southern Oregon
Trout angling remains good in the Rogue river and all its tributaries. Single eggs and flies are producing the best catches. Steelhead catches are improving daily in the Galice area. Fishing at Diamond lake is fair and most catches have been made still fishing.

In central Oregon, East and Paulina lakes have provided good fishing and late evening fly fishing has proven good. Wickiup reservoir also has been good. Large browns have been taken on troll. South Twin lake should also be considered for limit catches.

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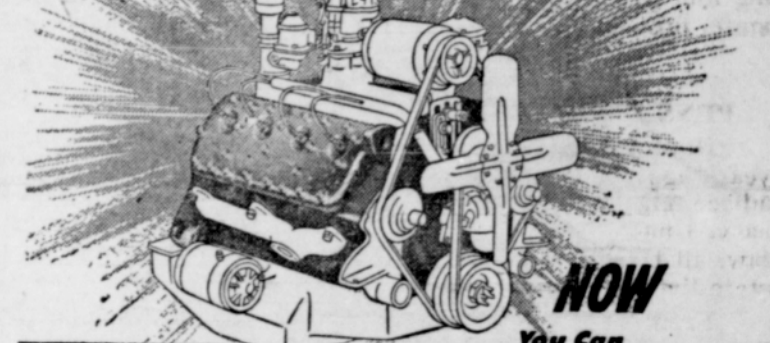
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
