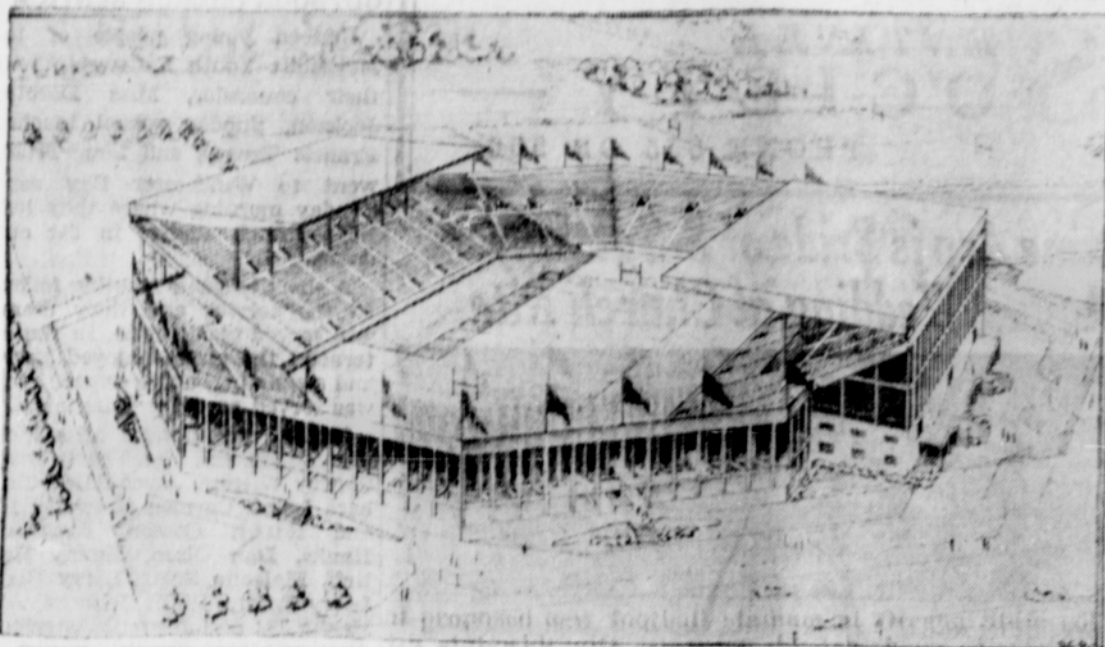

## OSC Alumni Begin Campaign For New Football Stadium

OREGON STATE COLLEGE — A campaign among alumni and friends of Oregon State college for a new football stadium, to be constructed in three phases, has just been launched under the leadership of Charles T. Parker, Portland businessman and chairman of the stadium executive committee of the O.S.C. Alumni association.

Solicitation of funds will start in Corvallis and will be extended throughout the state in early fall under the leadership of prominent alumni in the various districts and communities.

While the state board of higher education has provided a site for the new stadium south of the new coliseum, funds for actual construction can come only from gift sources, college officials point out. Present Bell field stadium, of frame and temporary construction, is considered entirely inadequate for present needs.

An ultimate seating capacity of 62,000 is planned for the new structure, while the first objective is permanent grandstands on either side of the field, one with a roof, with end-zone bleachers, giving a seating capacity of 35,000. When funds are needed warrant, the capacity will be expanded first to 49,000, with a second roof, and finally to 62,000 with all-concrete stands.

Bell Field, dedicated in 1921, is considered beyond the stage of rebuilding, and now occupies a

site needed for other purposes. Three years ago the wooden east stands were declared unsafe and were replaced by temporary bleachers. The main west grandstand is rickety and seats only 3800.



As the close of the fishing season approaches, reports from all parts of the state indicate that fishing is only fair. On the McKenzie and tributaries fishing is spotty although a number of good catches have been made on dry flies and troll.

Low water in the upper Willamette area has resulted in only fair fishing in all streams of eastern Lane county. However, pack lakes in the vicinity of Waldo, Crescent and Odell lakes are reported as being good.

**Coastal Section**  
Winchester bay has been fair to poor for salmon. Silvers are reported up the Umpqua river in the vicinity of Reedsport, but only a few have been taken. Some salmon are being caught in Nehalem, Tillamook, and Nestucca bays.

Blueback fishing is best in upper tidewater of the north coastal streams, while they aren't biting on the central and southern coast. Upstream trout fishing is reported fair on the Nestucca and poor on the Wilson river. Striped bass fishing at Coos bay continues poor, although a few large stripers have been taken on bullheads in Haines slough.

Rock and bay fishing for flounder, kelp, sea bass, ling-cod, and perch is good. Tom cod are now being taken at Garibaldi on Tillamook bay.

**Southern Oregon**  
Trout angling on the upper Umpqua continues slow. A few steelhead are being caught in the upper North Umpqua. Salmon-trout are in the lower river but catches so far have been poor.

Single egg fishing is producing good catches of trout in the middle sections of the Rogue river. Steelhead catches are being made incidental to trout fishing. Fly fishing is producing intermittent catches of steelhead in Galice Marial areas.

**Central Oregon**  
Wickiup reservoir has continued to yield many large fish ranging from three to eight pounds. Most of them have been brown trout, although several large rainbow also have been taken.

Conditions for pack trips into the mountain lakes are now at their best. The Waldo lake area has been yielding many limit catches, but Sparks and Todd lakes have been heavily fished and fewer reports of limit catches have been received.

Brook trout in East and Paulina

lakes should be in towards shore now and prospects for the week-end ought to be good. In the Deschutes river, mayflies and small white bucktails seem to be favorites for late evening fly fishing. Trolling is good with spinner and worms and flatfish.

Playing with Eastburn were: Stewart Carlson, Alton Jones and Hap Wolford, who witnessed the event. Observers say this was the first hole in one made on the local course in twenty years or more.

## PART OF DRAIN AREA REMOVED FROM DEER HUNT

Part of Southwestern Oregon was removed from the deer-hunting area to be opened for a "hunter's choice" season, Oct. 21-22. The state game commission said at Portland Saturday the area eliminated lies between the Siuslaw and Umpqua rivers, from Drain to the coast.

In the open area hunters who fail to get deer in the regular season will be allowed to shoot one deer of either sex.

Oregon State's first two home games — Stanford at Corvallis, October 7; and Washington at Portland, October 14 — will bring the Beavers against two of the top favored teams in the 1950 Pacific Coast conference race on successive weekends.

Mutual Broadcasting Company will carry the Oregon State-Michigan State intercollegiate football clash at East Lansing on September 23 on a nationwide network as "the game of the week."

Only two more series remain on the home schedule of the Portland Beavers.

Manager Bill Sweeney and his charges open their final home stand the week of September 19 against the San Francisco Seals and drop the curtain the week of September 26 against the Los Angeles Angels.

The Beavers will write finish to their 200-game schedule with a doubleheader Sunday, October 8, in San Francisco.

Pitcher Dick Waibel, ex-University of Oregon star, and Outfielder Marvin Diercks, ex-University of Portland football player and Seaside high ace, are among the Beaver farm-hands expected to be called in for a "look" during the last couple of weeks of the season.

Waibel has been hurrying for Eugene since signing with the Beavers and Diercks has been doing some hefty clouting for Reno, Nevada.

Eddie Basinski, the Portland Beavers' smooth-fielding second baseman, appears headed for a new Pacific Coast league iron man record.

Basinski has been in the lineup every day since the season's start and hopes he can make it an even

200 games started. This would easily surpass any of the old records.

He was taken from the game on a couple of recent occasions but only after he had played enough to get his name listed in the box score.

Luis Marquez, the Portland Beavers swift and hard-hitting fielder, is among a handful of players mentioned by the Pacific Coast Baseball News as a candidate for the Pacific Coast league's most valuable player award.

The crown was won last year by Irv Noren of Hollywood, now of the Washington Senators.

Joe Brovia, the Portland Beavers right fielder, has every intention of leading the Pacific Coast league in home runs this year.

As of recent date the husky left-hander was ahead of San Diego's powerhouse, Harry Simpson, by a small margin and he boldly announced that he plans to stay in front of him.

The remaining schedule favors Simpson, however. The San Diego clouter has a week in the Oakland park with its close-in right field fence, while Brovia will be playing in parks where the fences are more difficult to hurdle.

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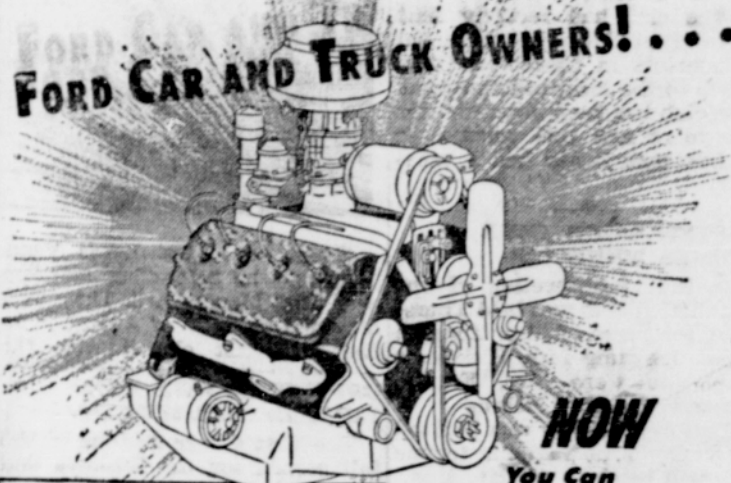
