Cars Loaned To CGUHS For Drivers Training

The Githens Motor Co. is again presenting to the Cottage Grove union high school a new Ford sedan to be used in its driver training classes for the school year. The new car is fully equipped with dual controls, radio, heater, and all necessary equipment.

It is loaned to the school for the year by the Githens Motor Co. without cost.

Francis Trusty will be the instructor again and hopes to have 48 students pass the tests for drivers licenses at the end of the year.

The Driver Training program provides opportunity for students to learn the fundamentals of driving. Later, they gain actual experience in behind the wheel driving on a special driving strip provided by W. A. Woodard.

To enable students to drive on the highway and in the city, training includes parking, starting, stopping, and various maneuvers to gain flexibility of control. Other aspects include developing a sound knowledge of traffic regulations, drivers' responsibilities, and the mechanical functioning of the car. The course is thought to be one of the most practical offered and one that will make safe drivers out of the students taking the course.

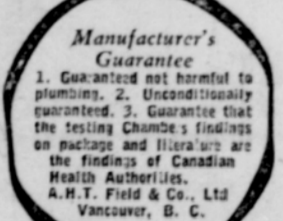

"Testing Chamber Findings"

Before Applying Septonic:
