NOTICE OF ELECTION FOR CITY OF COTTAGE GROVE, OREGON, NOVEMBER 7, 1950.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN: That an election will be held in the City of Cottage Grove, Oregon, on Tuesday, the 7th day of November, 1950, from the hour of eight o'clock in the forenoon to the hour of eight o'clock in the afternoon, and at said election a Charter Amendment entitled "An Act to amend the Charter of the City of Cottage Grove, Lane County, Oregon, by adding thereto a new chapter authorizing the Common Council to acquire, construct, install, operate, maintain, replace and repair within or without the limits of said city, in whole or in part, a complete sewer and drainage system and sewage disposal plant with all equipment and appurtenances necessary, all hereinafter included in the general term 'Sewer System'."

Section 2: For the purpose of providing funds with which to effectuate the purposes of this chapter the Common Council is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and sell general obligation bonds of the City in the amount of Four Hundred Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$400,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary; said bonds to bear date and to maintain as determined by the Council, but the first installment of principal shall fall due and be payable not later than five (5) years and the last installment not later than twenty-five (25) years from the date of issue, and the installments of principal and interest due in any year, shall be, as nearly as practicable, in such sums as will permit of an equal annual tax levy for the retirement of the interest in said bonds. Said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of not to exceed five (5) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually. The City of Cottage Grove may elect to issue said bonds with the privilege of retiring any or all of said bonds at par value and accrued interest, upon optional dates to be designated in said bonds in accordance with the provisions of Section 97-101 O.C.L.A., and all acts amendatory thereto.

Section 3: The Common Council is hereby authorized and empowered to fix and determine rates and to collect charges for the use of said sewer system and facilities and to fix and collect connection charges and to pledge the net revenues thereof, after payment of the operation and maintenance expense thereof, to the payment of the interest on, and to the retirement of the principal of the bonds herein above authorized.

Section 4: So long as any of said bonds, or any that may be issued to refund them, shall be outstanding, the Common Council of the City of Cottage Grove shall include in the Annual Tax levy of the City of Cottage Grove a sum sufficient with the aforesaid net revenues of the said sewer system, to pay the interest upon, and the principal of said bonds as the said obligation respectively become due and payable. The said tax shall be levied upon all the property within the said City so taxable for its purposes.

Section 5: The Common Council of the City of Cottage Grove, is hereby authorized to issue and sell the said bonds from time to time as it may be necessary for the purpose herein specified, but before any of the bonds shall be sold they shall be advertised for sale by publication in a newspaper published in Cottage Grove, Oregon, once a week for two successive and consecutive weeks prior to the date of sale, and it may also give notice of the sale of said bonds in such other papers as it may deem to be best for the interest of the City in effecting a sale. If no satisfactory bids for the purchase of the bonds be received, it may sell said bonds at private sale at not less than par and accrued interest.

Section 6: The indebtedness authorized by this amendment to the Charter of the City of Cottage Grove is in addition to all other indebtedness authorized and incurred by the City of Cottage Grove, and shall not be considered as affected by any limitation of the indebtedness in the Charter of the City, or elsewhere.

Section 7: The funds arising from the sale and disposal of all bonds provided for in this act shall be known as "Sewer System Bonds" and shall be kept separate and apart from all other funds of the City of Cottage Grove and shall only be used as in this act provided. 10-4tc-13
