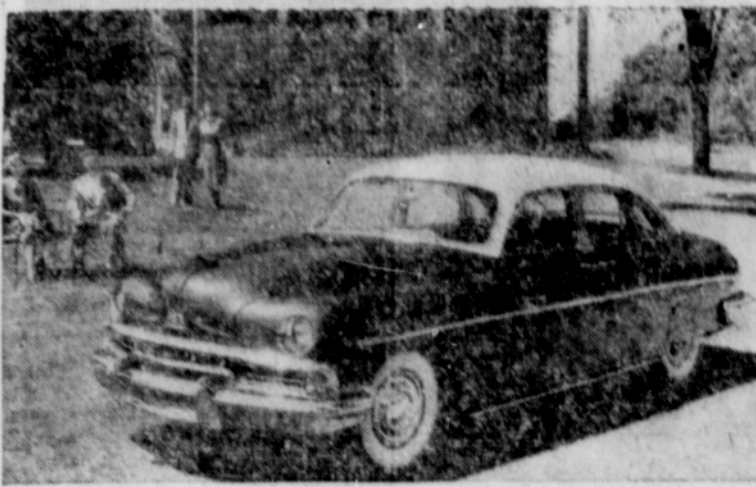

Mountain States To Buy Power From Bonneville

A. W. Trimble, President of Mountain States Power Company, today revealed that representatives of Mountain States, Puget Sound Power and Light, Washington Water Power, Portland General Electric and Pacific Power and Light had recently completed agreements with the Bonneville Power Administration for the purchase of available Bonneville power in amounts varying from 325,000 to 560,000 kilowatts, depending on the season of the year.

The five power companies comprise what is known as the Inter-Company Pool. This joint facility operation has been maintained for a number of years in an effort to utilize all of the available electric

power in the area and to supplement existing electric power with the purchase of energy from outside generating resources.

The Inter-Company Pool has been able to effect an economy of operation by the interchange of power between the five utilities. The most efficient generating plants of any of the member companies are the first to be placed in operation and more expensive steam plants are reserved for peak load periods of the pool system.

In addition to the exchange of power by the five companies, electric energy is also purchased from Montana, Utah and British Columbia during peak load periods.

Thanks to a difference in sunset time existing between utilities, the peak electric loads of each occur at different times. This is one factor which enables the Inter-Company Pool to more effectively utilize power.

Trimble said that Mountain States' share in the new power contracts was for amounts of electric power varying up to 30,000 kilowatts.
