Permits for Hauling Loads on Lane County Roads Are Listed

The list of regulations pertaining to permits required for hauling on Lane county roads has recently been released by County Judge Day T. Bayly.

They are as follows:

Heavy Hauling
December 20, 1950 order—Annual permits for heavy hauling, from 34,000 lbs. to 72,000 lbs., over Lane county roads, each permit expiring December 31 of the year issued—\$3.00.

Temporary heavy hauling over-weight permits, in excess of 72,000 lbs., issued to the parties having annual heavy hauling permit—\$2.00.

Temporary permit for hauling over-size objects on county roads—\$2.00.

The above temporary permits are for specific hauling for a limited time.

Log Hauling
Annual log hauling permits, each permit expiring December 31 of the year issued—\$5.00.

Temporary over-length log hauling permit issued party holding annual permit—\$2.00.

Approach Roads
Permit for temporary or permanent approach road onto county road to be used for logging or other commercial hauling—\$5.00.

Permit for residence or farm approach road—\$2.00.

It is also ordered that no person or firm may stand any trucks or other equipment on county roads rights of way while said equipment is being loaded with logs. Nor shall any driveway be established onto a county road without first obtaining a county permit.

Pipe Lines
January 3, 1951 Order

1. Permit to drive a pipe across a county road underneath the surface thereof—\$2.00.

2. Permit to dig a ditch across a county road not having rolled asphalt surface for a pipeline—\$5.00.

3. Permit to cut and dig a ditch across a county road at a place.

Barren Forest Lands Gain New Growth by Reseeding

SALEM, OREGON (Special)—The state forestry department has completed the seeding of 13,229 acres of denuded land under the rehabilitation program this year, according to Rudy Kallander, rehabilitation director for the department.

Poisoning for rodent control began in November and the seeding was completed in December. All seeding and poisoning was done by helicopter.

An area of 7,504 acres in the Tillamook burn was seeded with one-half pound of Douglas fir seed per acre and 5,100 acres in the Nicolai mountain area of Clatsop county was seeded with Douglas fir, spruce and hemlock. On the north slopes of Nicolai the mixture consisted of one-half pound of Douglas fir seed and one-quarter pound of hemlock per acre was sown. On the south slopes one-half pound of Douglas fir seed per acre was sown.

Kallander explained that the difference in seed mixtures for different localities is an effort to plant back on the land the species that do the best. "We cannot improve on nature," he said.

In addition, 625 acres of the Tom Rock burn in Linn county was seeded in a cooperative effort

between the rehabilitation and the research sections. The burn occurred early this fall. The higher elevations were seeded with one-half pound of high elevation Douglas fir seed per acre and the middle elevations with three-quarter pound of medium Douglas fir seed per acre. The difference in the amounts of seed per acre is to determine the quantity of seed needed to get an acceptable restocking after a fresh burn.

The planting program is being carried on in the Tillamook burn and in Clatsop county now and if weather and roads permit spring planting will be conducted in Lincoln county.

The department hopes to plant between three and four million trees during the planting season. Kallander said. Planting is progressing in a satisfactory manner. Kallander stated, and so far this year the weather has been favorable. However, the possibility of snow during January and February might curtail planting during these months. If this occurs, planting crews will be increased in strength during March and early April. Kallander indicated that planting usually stops in early April because of warmer and drier weather.
