Looking at Stamps



YOUR COLLECTION

People in general usually collect something or other, either for sentimental reasons of keeping something old in the family inheritance, remembrances of times past, or just plain human nature of hoarding something. We like to possess something of unusual nature or to be envied by others thru our possessions.

This nature in some becomes one of greed but to the majority it is the symptom of a "bug." This bug can begin with the love of a hunter to possess a fine gun and from there he begins a collection of guns old and new and unusual. China, buttons, salt and pepper shakers, nearly anything one can imagine.

Many people have an accumulation of fine things but they are tucked away some place usually to gather dust or to disintegrate from the lack of care. Paper needs air from time to time and a good many stamp collections have been lost from this very need of oxygen.

No matter what you collect it deserves care and can be enhanced with the addition of a story and even research—to know why and where of your collection.

The research on any collected item can be started with the addition of specializing the pictures on stamps of various countries of your desirable subject. The explanation of the stamp in the various publications can be its own history and also save you many hours of looking thru books for information.

For example a person can't very well save locomotives but he does gather pictures of them and for further knowledge and information he starts a "topical" collection of trains or locomotives. At the present time there are available over 22 countries depicting this subject on their stamps.

Other topical collections can be started from the pictures within the picture of the stamp—backgrounds of mountains, bodies of water, eye-glasses worn by the subjects, hair-dos of the women of the world, costumes and customs. These are only a few depicted on our stamps of the world.

Topical collections are of such nature that your time and expenditure can be one of immense research or limited to a very low means.

A postage stamp is issued to depict history or an event or to raise additional funds and the engraving and photo-engraving are made by our best artists in this field. All types of paper and printing are used throughout the world.

Don't overlook the hobby of research and education with the addition of a topical collection of postage stamps depicting your hobby, no matter what subject you desire.

Clerks, stenographers, book-keepers and other general office workers, when engaged in interstate commerce or in any closely related process or occupation directly essential to production of goods for interstate commerce, are covered by the Federal wage and hour law.
