Daredevils Race At Eugene June 23

More than \$100,000 worth of new automobiles and trucks will be jeopardized when the 1951 International Open Stunt Championships and the Joie Chitwood Auto Daredevil circus of death is held at the Fairgrounds in Eugene, this coming Saturday evening at 8:30.

The largest crowd in the history of local events is expected to be on hand to see the world renowned Chitwood daredevils compete with entrants from seven foreign countries, including Bill Ward's Canadian Aces, from Vancouver, B. C.; Angel Lopez y su Diablos del Timon, from Mexico, D. F.; Dutch Schnitzer's Flying Dutchmen from Austria and Harry Woolman's Hollywood Stuntmen.

On the competition program, for points in the International Stuntmen's Association title chase for the I.S.A. Gold Trophy and a \$10,000 purse, will be broadjumping new cars off an improvised precipice or distance and height, crash rolling sedans while the drivers remain at the wheel, and an obstacle stock car race with only 1951 sedans entered.

Featured on the thrill bill is the rocket leap of a 1951 sedan zooming over three other new cars racing underneath, crashing two sedans head-on with an 80-mile-an-hour impact while the drivers remain fast to the wheels and topped off by Lucky Walters, the Human Bomb, who will blow himself up in a casket with 20 sticks of dynamite.

All of the drivers will attempt these feats in person and demonstrate what it is to compete to the ultimate degree of durability of both man and machine.

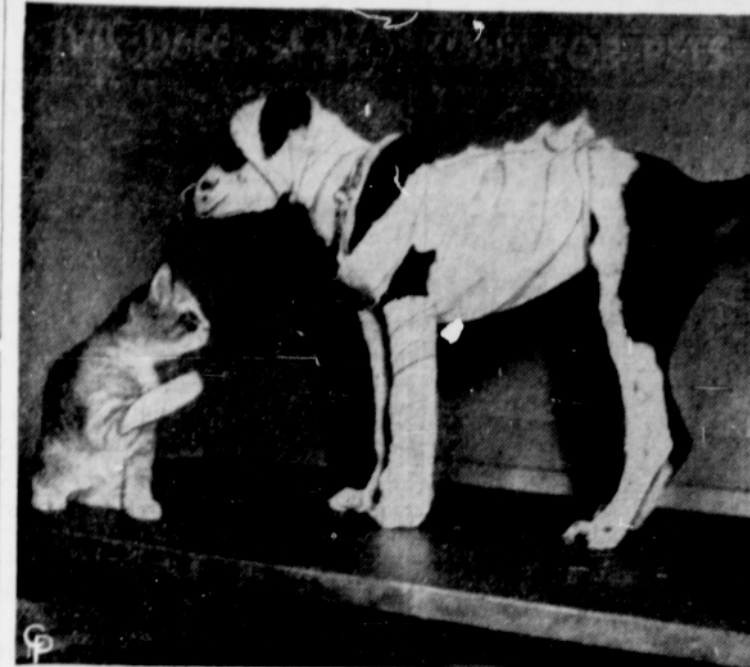
Local Men Compete In P. I. T. A. Shoot
