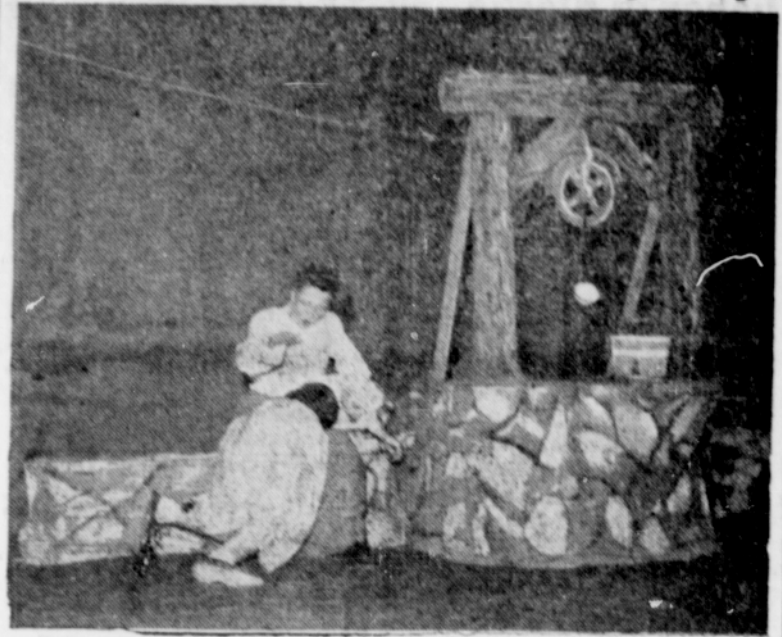

Nationally Touring Abbey Players Coming to Cottage Grove Sunday, July 1



When Cottage Grove audiences view the nationally touring Abbey Players' presentation of "Lady of Fatima" in the high school auditorium Sunday, July 1, they will undoubtedly join the swelling ranks of American theatre-goers who have received and are receiving this fresh and vital drama with enthusiasm.

Currently on a national tour which is taking them into the leading cities of 17 western, mid-western, eastern states, the Abbey Players will make their Cottage Grove appearance their exclusive one in Oregon. They will come direct from California where they have played in Los Angeles, Oakland, and Sacramento.

The delightful two act drama by Urban Nagle tells the story of the actual happenings at Fatima, Portugal, in 1917, when the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to three small children, Lucia Osa Santos aged 10, Francisco and Jacinta

Marto aged 9 and 7 respectively. The apparitions numbered six in all, the first one occurring on May 13, and the final one on October 13.

The events leading up to the famous "Miracle of the Sun" witnessed by 70,000 people at the time of the final apparition together with the effects which these events had on the lives of the three small children and the simple Fatima villagers is effectively portrayed by the Abbey cast.

The production, which is being sponsored by the Cottage Grove Catholic Daughters and Knights of Columbus, was presented to a closed audience of west coast drama students and critics at the University of Oregon last fall.

Community Life Theme of Rural Church Institute

Oregon State College — Cultivating church and community cooperation will be featured through six panel discussions at the 1951 Leadership Institute for Town and Country Churches at Oregon State college July 10 to 13, according to Dr. E. W. Warrington, professor of religion and philosophy at OSC, and institute co-chairman.

Panel discussions will center on church architecture, landscaping of the rural church, religious leadership, farm organization cooperation, improving church and community youth programs, school operation and contributions of various church and community relationships.

The institute is intended for all lay as well as ministerial leaders interested in raising the spiritual life of Oregon's rural communities.

Rev. Martin Edbo of North Richland, Wash., representative of the Home Missions Council of North America, and Rev. George Murphy of John Day, representing the Archdiocese of Portland in Oregon, have been scheduled as the main speakers at the four-day meet.

The institute, sponsored jointly by three church and four farm groups and OSC, will also feature a series of tours, including the OSC agriculture experiment station farms, home management houses, nursery school and research projects, and student religious centers.
