Timber Carnival Set for July 2, 3, 4

The ten Albany and Linn county girls who are competing for the honor of reigning over the Seventh Annual World Championship Timber carnival at Albany, July 2, 3, and 4 will make an appearance over Portland's radio station KGW, June 29, it has been announced.

In addition to appearing on the station's popular "Hostess House Party" air show, the bevy of beauties will serve as guest hostesses following the broadcast.

As a special feature of the program, winners of a "Safe and Sound Fourth" jingle contest which began June 13, will be special guests of the Albany Chamber of Commerce and the Timber Carnival for the celebration.

Full festivities for two, including lodging and meals in Albany have been arranged.

Prizes are also offered for runners-up in the jingle contest.

Agency Screens Clinic Candidates

The screening of candidates for a six-week speech and hearing clinic at the Easter Seal agency's children's hospital school, Eugene is now under way throughout the state, according to Howard Feast, executive director of the Oregon Society for Crippled Children and Adults, the Easter Seal agency.

The clinic will be held each Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, starting July 9. Max O'Connell, speech therapist at the hospital school, will be in charge, and medical counsel will be provided by five medical specialists provided by the Lane County Medical Society.

Consultation service will also be offered by the University of Oregon speech department.

Candidates are being referred to the clinic through the state department of public health and the special education department of the public schools, Feast reported.

Feast said the clinic was made possible by the donation of auditory training equipment by the Histon Women's club of Washington county and the Junior Women's clubs of St. Helens and Hillsboro.

Additional donations are expected from other organizations.

Author of Popular Song, "Lady of Fatima," to be With Abbey Players



Touring with the Abbey Players on their nation-wide circuit this summer is Mrs. Gladys Gallohan, author of the popular song, "Lady of Fatima," which rocketed to a place on the hit parade some weeks ago. Mrs. Gallohan will appear with the company when the play, "Lady of Fatima" is presented in the high school auditorium Sunday evening, July 1, at 8:30.

The principle characters in the drama, which is playing in Oakland and Sacramento, California, this week, are three small children, who see the vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Fatima, Portugal.

The play itself is a beautifully told story, dramatically presented against a background of professional stage settings and expert technical effects. The lighting, especially in the miracle scenes, is so perfect that it is difficult to believe that it could be accomplished with portable lighting equipment.

One of the high-lights of the play is the jail scene. The country at this time is under the control of the New Republic, which is trying to stamp out religion, and consequently the jails are full of political prisoners. As a result of the disturbances which follow on the apparitions in the Cova de Iria near Fatima, the civil authorities throw the three children into prison. There they meet "Pop," a habitual drunk; "Castro," a strong-armed periodical drinker; and the government administrator, who threatens to torture the children unless they retract their story relative to the events at Fatima.

Prior to their national tour this summer, the Abbey Players had traveled 15,000 miles, presented the show in 35 cities. In 48 performances, they had played to 36,000 people. These figures have considerably increased in the last several weeks, and will again, of course when the company appears in the Cottage Grove high school auditorium next Sunday evening, July 1, at 8:30.

GIFTS, DONATIONS TO OSC TOTAL \$300,000 PAST YEAR

Oregon State College—Gifts, grants and donations valued at more than \$300,000 were received by Oregon State college this past year, according to OSC officials.

The gifts included hundreds of different grants, scholarships, art works, books, equipment and other items, but the major portion of the contributions was for various types of scientific research in the schools of science, agriculture, forestry and engineering and in the agricultural and engineering experiment stations.

Various forms of student welfare benefited to the extent of about \$19,000. The total does not include approximately \$250,000 in cash and pledges to the stadium fund.
