Subversive Texts?

There have been a great many articles written in current slick magazines about subversive texts in America's schools. One literary magazine recently devoted almost its entire issue to the problem, not only of subversion, but all kinds of so-called "crises" in the public schools. Some of the criticism is legitimate, but it seems that it is a big uproar with some twisted facts.

For instance a certain set of encyclopedias, or what might better be called articles on current events, has been called subversive and put on the black list for schools. Elmer Fleming, our local elementary superintendent, became curious about these books, since the school library had them on file. He spent one whole week end trying to find what was subversive about them. Your reporter, calling at the school, also looked them over.

They were not subversive. They were just out of date. The only subversive angle that could possibly be attached to them was that the thinking in 1944 and 1945 of American people toward Russia was somewhat different than it is today.

There was a section in one volume devoted to Russia, its people, its one-man government. The article states that about 60 percent of Americans during those years just before the end and just after the end of World War II believed that Russia would be friendly toward us. Today the percentage believing that would be very, very small.

Just because a text or reference book tells about one-man government, that is not subversive. That is telling the student just how the opposition works.

An informed student can judge for himself. One article in this same text started off something like this, "Does Russia intend to communize the world?" The answer, as it was to many of us in those years, was "Of course not." But then, the article also said Russia did not intend to democratize itself.

This was not subversive then. But in 1951 we know it is in direct antithesis to what has been written and said about world domination.

This reminds us of the mud slinging that is going on in Washington. Anyone who was friendly to Russia in those brighter days is now thought to be Communist or at the best on the pink fringe. But who, at that time, did not have a shred of hope that Russia would be a big, new friend? And did not some of us call Stalin "Uncle Joe"?

The purpose of education is to teach the facts. But facts change. Then the teacher and student should see the change and understand why. Just because facts change, that is no sign that all of our old histories are subversive. Wonder if they said the same thing about the friends of England after the Revolution? Looks like those friends are still around, in fact having a great deal of influence on our country and state department.

UTILIZING ALL OF OUR RESOURCES

It was Loran Stewart, we believe who came forward with a very sensible suggestion to help end the power shortage and this was to use the surplus energy of some of the mills scattered over the territory. The first instance of this nature we heard of was the arrangement between the W. A. Woodard Lumber Co., and the Mt. States Power Co., to supply the latter company with something like 3,000 kilowatts of power. If this arrangement is practical and it evidently is, numbers of other mills including the Bohemia Lumber Co., with which Stewart is connected, would be able to supply all the power needed to pull us out of the present crisis as well as to insure a dependable future supply.

In this connection the meeting of power officials in Eugene only a few days ago brought out there is a vast potential in the wood waste in supplying both power and new industries. A start has been made toward both complete wood utilization and supplying extra power needed in shortages such as at present.

Utilization of wood wastes means greater payrolls from the same amount of timber cut. If we are to exist, this is the direction we must take.

HALLOWEEN CLINICS

We note Portland is holding what is known as the "Halloween Clinic" for mothers and those preparing to entertain the youngsters on Halloween night. So far the clinic, where the mother is shown how to entertain the youngsters, has been a success. According to the Oregonian it was estimated that over 25,000 youngsters attended special entertainment provided for them last year and were thus kept off the street and out of destructive mischief. In the past years here efforts to provide wholesome entertainment for the youngster have been more or less spasmodic, but where earnest efforts have been made to provide the right sort of entertainment, the youngsters have been found to be responsive. We hope the opportunity to provide entertainment will not be passed this year. For without any supervision, a group of youngsters running on the street can be pretty destructive.

SIGNAL LIGHT FOR SIXTH AND MAIN

The time has arrived when the city should give serious consideration to the installation of a traffic light at Sixth and Main. Those who have occasion to cross Main from Sixth realize that it can be both annoying and dangerous. Due to the narrow streets, a motorist can not see if the main thoroughfare is clear until he often gets in the pedestrian lane and once in the pedestrian lane he often has to stay there until the main drag is clear. More often he can't back up and when he can't the pedestrian lane is stopped.

Because Main was established as a through street those traveling up and down this street have the right of way and regardless how heavy the traffic is on any intersecting street, the intersecting street traffic must wait until Main is clear, even though the wait is considerably longer than between signals of a traffic light. Long waits sometimes produce impatience and impatience adds to the traffic hazards.

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Patient Succumbs To Knife Stabs And Heart Ailment

Self-inflicted wounds from a pocket knife by a patient at the Barber Nursing Home in Eugene and a heart condition were the cause of death Saturday night of a Cottage Grove man.

Dead was Lester Shortridge, 61, of Cottage Grove, who stabbed himself repeatedly in the neck with a pocket knife after complaining from unbearable pain due to his heart condition and other ailments.

According to Coroner Fred Buell, death was due to heart failure, as the wounds were not judged serious enough for hospitalization. Buell also said that an autopsy showed that loss of blood was not a decisive factor in death, but shock could have been responsible for the heart failure.

Lester R. (Bud) Shortridge was a lifelong resident of Lane county, born at London on June 8, 1890, and lived the greater portion of his life in Cottage Grove. He was married to Loretta Burnette in Eugene in 1916. For the past years, he had resided in Eugene. Shortridge was a member of the local Eagles lodge.

Surviving are his widow; one son, Kenneth, of Oakland, Calif.; one daughter, Wanda Steckly of Oakland, California; two grandsons; three sisters: Mrs. Ann Adams, Mrs. Lillie Sutherland and Mrs. Frankie McKay, all of Cottage Grove; and one brother, Sam Shortridge of Cottage Grove.

Services were held at Mills Mortuary, Wednesday, October 24, at 2:30 p.m., with the Rev. Edgar W. White officiating. Interment was in the Taylor-Lane cemetery.

partment it is revealed that 4,981 persons have returned to retake centers for the large or 14" x 17" x-ray film.

It also revealed that of the 1,210 cases of tuberculosis found in the survey, 590 cases are minimal, 243 cases moderately advanced, 26 cases far advanced, 23 cases unclassified and 328 cases classified as suspected tuberculosis.

Retake centers in Lane will be open as late as November 10, when the Eugene center will close, completing operations.

Washington Next

Upon completion of the actual x-raying program in the Willamette survey the equipment of the U. S. Public Health Service, loaned for this survey, will move to Washington where a survey will be made in the four counties of Clark, Cowitz, Skamania and Wahkiakum.

X-raying will start in that area November 15 and be concluded December 15. The retake centers, however, will probably be open throughout December.

A meeting of the board of directors of the Willamette Valley Chest X-Ray, Inc., was held Tuesday, October 23, in Valley Headquarters offices in the old Salem high school building, 495 North Church Street, it was announced by Robert M. Ashby, president.

Ashby said business included plans for closing the survey, hearing reports on 70 mm. x-rays, the program in general, evaluation of the survey and a report on finances. In addition to the members of the board, health officers, O. T. H. A. secretaries, health educators and others interested in the program were invited.
