## John O. Hay Dies

A high climber passed away Wednesday while at work as the result of a heart attack. John Oscar Hay, 62, of Portland, passed away suddenly while working as a high climber for Elmo Aldridge, logging contractor, seven miles from Lorane on the Siuslaw.

Hay was 65 to 75 feet from the ground when Aldridge noticed his fall fell to the ground. When he investigated, he saw Hay's body hanging to a tree branch. Aldridge summoned help to get the body down and notified Lane County Coroner Fred Buell, who investigated. The body was removed to Bartholomew-Buell Chapel in Springfield where an autopsy was to have been held today.

Funeral arrangements are pending the arrival of Hay's wife from Portland.
