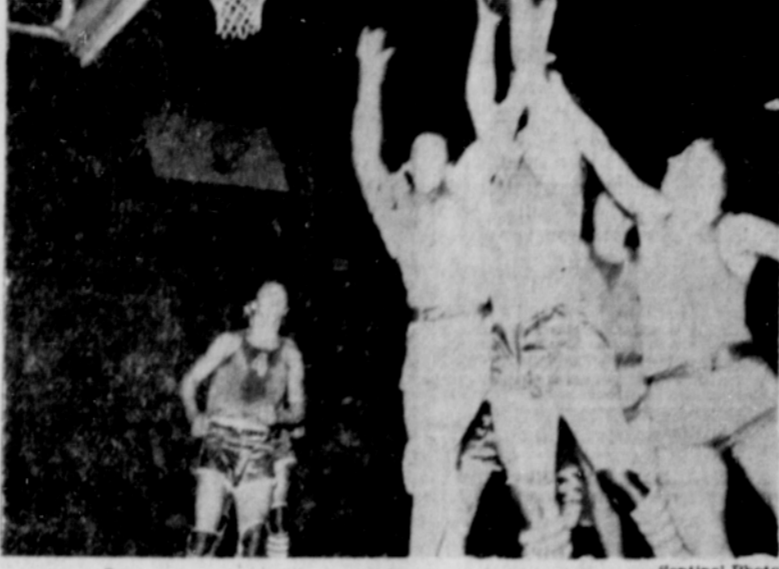

Cavemen Topple Lions in 34-14 Tilt

The Grants Pass Cavemen re-venge an earlier 34-37 defeat in the hands of the Cottage Grove Lions Friday night by outscoring them in the final quarter and going on to win 44-34. The Cavemen quickly racked up 14 points to Grove's 6 before the Grovers could get rolling. The Lions' defense then tightened up and their offense began to click. Seconds after the second half began Piller put up a crumple and drew a foul making the score 19-18 for Grove. The score was tied at 20-20 then Grove enjoyed a 27-23 lead before Grants Pass clamped down and started to pot baskets. In a few minutes the score stood 27-27 and then 28-34 for the Cavemen at the end of the third quarter. Things went from bad to worse for the Lions and when they reached 30 points they couldn't seem to hit the bucket while Grants Pass roared on until they hit 42. With two minutes to go the Grovers halted the Cavemen and put in four free throws making it a 34-42 game. But seconds before the whistle sounded a Caveman sank a long one leaving the count at 34-44. Grants Pass dominated the backboards and had a high shooting average while Grove, especially in the last quarter, couldn't seem to get the range of the hoop. Mr. and Mrs. William Kernutt and Sharon of Eugene were recent callers in the neighborhood and also attended the school program.

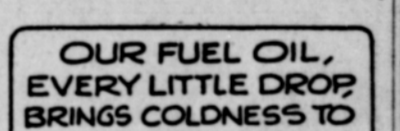
We have five inches of snow here this morning so we are having a bit of winter weather. This makes it bad for woods crews which have been working and will probably call for another shutdown.
