Uni high seemed to be having an off night, missing many rebound shots. During the first half the Eugene squad scored only one field goal, with 7 points scored from free throws.

Quarter scores were as follows, the Lions being ahead all the time. 1st, 10-5; half, 20-9; 3d 33-21.

High man for the Lions was Malcolm, forward, who scored 12, followed by Duer, forward, with 9. Radway, guard, scored 8; Isley, center, 4, and Piller, guard, 1. Smith, a sub forward, tossed it in for 2, with Pynch, a sub guard, scoring 1. Higdon, sub for Isley, did not score.

The Lions defense was good during the whole game, with Duer doing well on rebounds. Radway and Piller also showed hustle and played good floor games.

High man for Uni high was Shultz, center, with 10. Gubrud, forward, scored 8; Moriarity, guard, 2, with Caudel, regular guard, not scoring. Subs scoring were Schaffner, forward, 7, and Whiteley, guard, 1. Wilcox, a sub forward, did not score.

Grove Quint Edges Springfield 42-40 In 1st League Game

Cottage Grove won their first league battle and ran the count to six wins for eight games when they edged the Springfield Millers Friday in a 42-40 tussle.

Springfield led from the beginning and racked up 14 points to Grove's 8 until the Lions tightened up their defense and started to score. Springfield never scored a point for the rest of the first half which ended at 20-14 for the Grovers.

The score stood at 20-17 in the early part of the third quarter before Isley dumped in a counter to put Grove on the scoring ladder that Radway, being benched for the second half. It was here second quarter because of three fouls, fouled out.

With the Grovers, especially Malcolm and Isley, getting the range of the hoop the margin increased to 35-25 at the end of the third quarter.

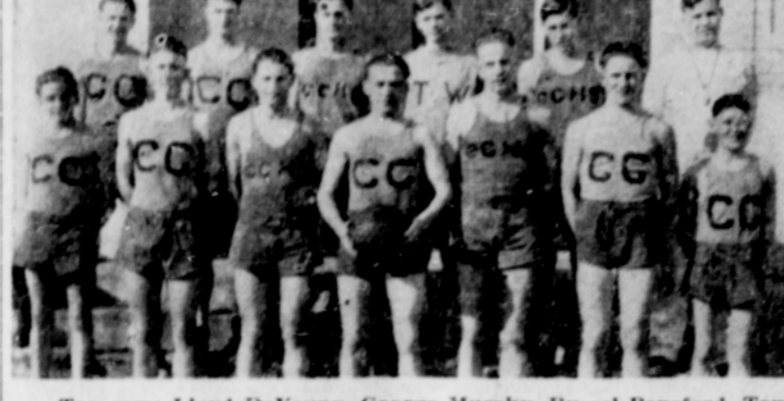

The basketball team of 1930 didn't seem to have as much luck as the present basketball team has had, winning only one out of twelve games. To top this off none of the games were written up, only a brief mention of the score and sometimes a comment on the game being given.

Here are the writeups of the games with the comments.

"Cottage Grove, which defeated Lebanon in its first home game, is out to make its second home game a victory when they meet Springfield Friday, and Coach Bert Kerns will put a strong quintet on the court."

"The locals lost to Corvallis high school 45-16 Friday night at Corvallis. Dale Gates, Cottage Grove forward, was high point man, scoring 14 of his team's 16 points."

"Springfield high school defeated the locals 31 to 8 Friday night on the gymnasium floor. The visitors showed a clever brand of floor work and maintained an edge over the locals throughout the game. Dale Gates, forward, who had been high point man for Cottage Grove in several games, was closely checked by the Springfield hoopers and had little chance to break free and score."

"University high school of Eugene defeated the Cottage Grove high school basketball team 31 to 19 Friday evening on the local gym floor. The visitors used a fast breaking offensive that the locals were unable to check and soon piled up a commanding lead at 15-15."

"Cottage Grove staged a rally in the last quarter but was unable to overhaul the long lead of the campus quintet. The score at the start of the fourth quarter was

"Oregon State College, Corvallis, January 10—Washington's defending northern division basketball champs, ranked third in the nation in the AP poll last week, come to Corvallis for an important two-game series with Slat's Gill's Oregon State Beavers in Gill Coliseum Friday and Saturday."

Some of the glitter was taken off the highly touted Huskies when Idaho's Vandals upset Tippy Dye's crew, 56-51, in Seattle last Friday. But the Huskies came back strong the next evening to trounce the upstarts from Moscow by a decisive 61-42 count.

Defending Champs Will Play Beavers

In posting 10 triumphs in 12 starts to date Washington's well-balanced and veteran quintet has defeated such clubs as UCLA, Utah, St. Louis, North-western and Minnesota.

Bob Houbregs, brilliant 6-7 center, has been the top Husky star to date, averaging 19.2 points per game in his first 10 games. He suffered a pulled Achilles tendon in the first Idaho contest and missed Saturday's game. Oregon State's chances against the Huskies would be enhanced greatly if Houbregs is unable to play this week end.

Other Washington starters, all veterans and all deadeye shots, include Capt. Frank Guiness, all-coast forward, and Doug McClary, 6-8 junior forward; and Joe Cipriano and Mike McCutcheon, a pair of speedy junior guards. Toughest thing about the Huskies is that all five regulars are such excellent shots that it is impossible for the defense to drop off any one man to concentrate on Houbregs or Guiness.

Oregon State continued its in and out tendencies when it split its league openers with Washington State here last week end. The Beavers shot 340 from the field and looked sharp in winning Friday, 53-45. But the next night the Orange shooting average dropped off to 264 and the club lost 54-44. At that, Gill's men were in the game until the last five minutes when the count stood 37-44.

Jim Padgett, veteran forward, led the Beavers in scoring in the conference openers with 23 for the two games, but Danny Johnston continues to lead the squad for the season with 110,

Harlem Hoopsters Will Play Jan. 22 At McArthur Court

University of Oregon, Eugene—The fabulous Harlem Globetrotters, one of the world's greatest basketball teams will make their second annual appearance at McArthur Court on January 22, it has been announced by Leo Harris, Oregon Athletic director.

The touring Trotters, who are now in their Silver anniversary season, will meet a team composed of former Oregon and Oregon State basketball stars. Last year the two teams played before a sell-out crowd and the Trotters won with a second half spurt.

Outstanding Record
In the past 24 years the Trotters have won a fantastic total of 3908 games and lost only 252 for a winning percentage of 939. During the 1950-51 campaign Abe Saperstein's crew of entertaining cage experts played 340 games and won 324 of them.

The year started in September, 1950 and the first 154 games included the regular schedule played by the Trotters. The Minneapolis Lakers, led by George Mikan, handed the Trotters their lone defeat in this part of the season by winning 72-68 before 17,054 fans at Minneapolis.

World Tour
The Trotters then moved to Cuba to win the Cuban Invitational returned to the States for the cross country tour against the Collegiate All-Americans, journeyed through South America for 46 games and then moved on to North Africa. The next stop was Europe and the season then ended with a summer outdoor junket through the United States.
