

Cottage Grove Cagers Overwhelm Willamette 55-35; Cubs Win 57-36

Cottage Grove made up, in points at least, for their Junction City "Surprise" by drubbing the Willamette Wolverines 55-35 Friday night.

Cottage Grove broke the scoring column first when Malcolm dumped in a counter. Seconds later LeRoy Wacker, Willamette's star player who was held to a mere 4 points, scored to put the Wolverines as close as they ever came to winning all night.

It wasn't long before the score stood 14-6, with the quarter ending at 16-7. By the middle of the second quarter Grove had 22 markers and Willamette still had 7, but they put on a "rally" as the half ended at 26-16.

As the second half opened Radway tossed through a ball, giving the Lions a 12 point lead. The lead lengthened until the end of the third quarter, when Cottage Grove lead 40-25.

It was here Willamette closed the gap to 12 points before the Lions started rolling again. With the score 49-34 Isley, who just couldn't seem to miss, broke the fifty column, leaving Cottage Grove with a 17 point lead. The Lions continued to rack up points as the whistle sounded. The 55-35 score gave Cottage Grove their most decisive victory of the season.

Willamette couldn't seem to crack Cottage Grove's iron clad defense. Half of their points were from the foul line with almost all the rest coming from long pot shots out past the key.

Cubs Beat Strong Springfield 40-22

Jefferson's Cubs upset Springfield's top team by the big count of 40-22 in a thrilling home game played Tuesday night. Coaches said this was the first time in five years that Springfield had brought its top squad here to play the Cubs. The Springfield school has three teams.

This makes it 9 wins and only 1 loss for the Cubs, having dropped only a game by just one point to Oakridge.

Lead All Way

The Cubs led the ball game all the way, with the first quarter ending 11-3, the second 18-9 and the third 24-16. Jefferson scored 16 points in the last period to Springfield's 6.

The B squad was not so fortunate, dropping its tilt to the Springfield B's 31-10.

Cottage Grove continued to lengthen the lead and at the end of the third quarter Cottage Grove had a 21 point lead. The second string was in again and a free throw by Dyksterhuis put Grove in the 50 column, with the score 50-27. Cottage Grove held its lead and went on to win 57-36.

Cottage Grove was a pistol hot ball club and its shooting average in the second quarter was well over the 500 mark. The only kind of shot "Cactus" Ken Sloan wasn't hitting was the drop kick, as he racked up 21 markers. Montgomery was next high for the Grovers with 11. Slick paced his teammates with 15 points.

Defensively Cottage Grove played a heads up ball game, especially Crabb, who kept stuffing the ball down Willamette's throat. Cottage Grove might have racked up several more points, but the experience did the second and third string good.

This particular 100th bobcat was shot on the Art Gilham place just back of his house. Gilham noticed tracks around his place and notified Eastham who brought his hounds and had it treed and killed within 30 minutes.

After only three days practice the Cottage Grove high school basketball team administered a proper defeat to the Harrisburg team on the local armory floor Friday night. Score, Cottage Grove 21, Harrisburg 16.

The most remarkable feature of the game was the manner in which Cottage Grove came back in the second half after allowing Harrisburg to run the score to 12-10 in the first half.

McLain for Harrisburg starred at forward, while all Cottage Grove players played well, the work of Smith and Anlauf standing out particularly. Anlauf and Smith each scored three baskets and Dugan one, while Smith made good seven of ten tries at fouls.
