Rev. G. Loree To Speak March 16 At Lenten Service

The Rev. Grayden D. Loree, pastor of the First Baptist Church of Reedsport, Oregon, will bring the Lenten message of the United Methodist Church at the Presbyterian Church at 7:30 p.m. Sunday, March 16. His message will be "Look at the Cross." The Baptist, Methodist and Presbyterian churches have arranged these outstanding pre-Easter services. The Rev. W. W. Sutterlin will be in charge.

Native of Wisconsin
Rev. Grayden Loree has lived most of his life in Oregon although he was born in Wisconsin. He graduated from Western Baptist Theological Seminary in Portland in 1940 and was ordained into the ministry in the same year. His interest has been to serve in town and country churches or missions. He has held three pastorates before coming to Reedsport. When he came there in 1948 the church was only a mission church, but under his leadership it is completely self-supporting and very actively meeting the needs of that lively community.

Oregon Baptist Convention
Mr. Loree is serving on the board of managers of the Oregon Baptist Convention and is also chairman of the Town and Country Commission of that Convention.

He is married and has two boys 11 and 14.

His special interests include boys work, marriage counseling and summer camps. His work with boys groups and young people is outstanding.

In addition to bringing the message for these Lenten services he will lead the First Baptist church in a week of evangelistic meetings and home visitation.

Free Methodists To Observe Field Day Evangelism

Field day for the Commission on Evangelism will be observed March 16, in the Free Methodist Church at 915 South Sixth street, announced the local pastor, the Rev. C. B. Starkey. The present day challenge to the church in the field of evangelism and the importance of evangelism in a church program will be the theme for this church-wide special day.

Sections of Maine, Texas, North Carolina, Georgia, Florida and Washington are included in the 25 new areas that the Free Methodist Church surveyed and entered in the past year, states the Rev. R. B. Campbell, executive secretary for the commission. The congregations organized and churches built in these new areas have helped the commission maintain an average of one new church per month since 1935.

Plans are now under way to survey the Alaskan territory with view to beginning an evangelistic program in that area. At present there are several young people who secured employment in Alaska and are doing personal evangelism along with their regular work.

MISSION CONFERENCE IN EUGENE MARCH 13-14

The Northwest Missionary Conference for the Churches of Christ will be held in the Eugene Armory Thursday and Friday, March 13 and 14. Registration will begin Thursday afternoon and out-of-town guests will receive housing assignments. The conference begins at 7:00 p.m. Thursday. There will be a morning session commencing at 9:00 a.m. Friday, and an afternoon session at 1:30. A missionary banquet will be held in the First Baptist Church at 5:15 followed by the closing session of the conference at 7:30 Friday evening.

THOUSANDS ATTEND RELIGIOUS SERVICES IN THE PENTAGON
—The great concrete structure housing the U. S. Department of Defense, across the Potomac River from Washington, D. C., has a new distinction. Here on each working day members of all faiths among the more than 30,000 military and civilian personnel may attend church services of their chosen faith. Depicted above is the illuminated bulletin board in the concourse of the building calling the people to worship. Under the direction of Chaplain (Col.) William B. Estes two auditoriums have been set aside as chapels. In one of these at 12 o'clock noon mass is said by a Catholic chaplain. At the same hour in another chapel a chaplain of the Jewish faith holds service. Protestant worship is held at 12:45 p.m. when chaplains of the various protestant denominations from time to time conduct the services. Civilian pastors occasionally are invited to participate.

His messages for the week of March 16 to 23 are as follows: Sunday, 11 a.m., "The Man Christ Jesus"; 7:30 p.m., "Look at the Cross"; Monday 7:30 p.m., "The King of Kings"; Tuesday 7:30 p.m., "The Cup Which the Father Gave"; Wednesday 7:30 p.m., "Betrayed by His Own"; Thursday 7:30 p.m., "Prisoner Tries His Judges"; Friday 7:30 p.m., "The Shepherd is Smitten." (There will also be a birthday celebration that night for our church.) There will be no services on Saturday. Sunday morning at 11 o'clock Mr. Loree will close his messages with the sermon "God's Road Blocks." During the meeting Mr. Loree will also show color slides of boys work and summer camps.

Home Visitations
This evangelistic crusade is a combination of the methods of the New Testament. There is home visitation and personal witnessing as taught by Jesus and seen in the book of Acts along with great preaching as read in various parts of the New Testament. Last year a similar program was arranged but with only the home visitation.

Previous to this crusade and in preparation for it there has been a period of six weeks of prayer. The emphasis was on Jesus' instructions to us regarding prayer. For the last weeks there have been cottage prayer meetings each Wednesday evening throughout the city.

Meet For Instruction
Each evening at 6:15 visitation teams will meet for supper and instruction. Mrs. P. J. Bush is in charge of the meal arrangements. Rev. Grayden Loree will train those who are going to visit in the homes. Then at 7:30 while the teams are calling there will be evangelistic services at the church. As the teams go, two by two, they will have as prayer partners other members of the church who cannot do the visiting. Mrs. Salem Magnusson is in charge of the special music and Mr. Kenneth Bush will be the song leader.

Wednesday evening March 12 closes our series of cottage prayer meetings.
