der the plan to rid the government of duplication. The main idea, according to his explanation, was that all financial matters concerning all departments would be centered in a finance department.

Mr. Siegenthaler said his main objection to the present system was that "You cannot place the responsibility. There is no integration. In a business you must be able to place responsibility, and it should be that way in government. At the courthouse now everything is kicked off to someone else."

Mr. Warlick, speaking again, explained that the plan was adopted by the state legislature in 1945 and is controlled by state law.

In answer to a charge that the C of C should not be mixed up in politics, Mr. Warlick said that the idea was to get government out of politics.

"We don't care whether a man is a republican or democrat, only we do care if he is a good man," he said.

"What we want is to get the measure on the ballot, then the people can discuss and decide if they want to vote for or against the plan at the primary."

Asked about increase in costs due to a change-over to the manager plan, Mr. Siegenthaler admitted that bigger salaries would have to be paid for a good manager and good department heads.

However, he said, the fact that good men are in the job means that they can save the county money.

Asked as to the power of the manager in awarding contracts, Mr. Todd explained that all contracts or purchases were let by bids—that the manager had no authority to purchase, and that the board itself created a purchasing agency.

Speaking on what he called "the sad experience of Cottage Grove with the manager plan" Warlick said that "perhaps your case was one of personalities, as there is nothing wrong with the plan."

## Local Team Enters Willamette Relays

Willamette University, Salem, (Special)—A total of 100 high schools and 20 colleges and universities—more than 2000 athletes in all—will compete in the second annual Willamette Relays track carnival set for McCulloch Field Saturday, April 5th.

Cottage Grove high school will send a full track team to the event, according to Coach Bob Dusenberry. This will include two first place winners in last year's Willamette relays, Doyle Higdon, broad jump, and Ray Arthur, javelin.

100 Races

The mammoth show will include 100 races—every one a final. That means that 100 athletes will wear first-place ribbons, and in addition there will be a big field for the field events.

Colleges entered are Central Washington, College of Idaho, Eastern Oregon, George Fox, Lewis and Clark, Linfield, Olympic Junior College, OCE, Oregon State, OSC Frosh, Pacific, University of Oregon, Oregon Frosh, Portland University, University of Washington, Vanport College, Western Washington, Whitworth and Willamette.

Few are the high schools in Oregon not entered in the meet. They total 92 in all.

High schools from the state of Washington include Auburn, Battle Grounds, Centralia, Clover Park, Kelso, Lewis and Clark, (Spokane), Mount Vernon and Vancouver.

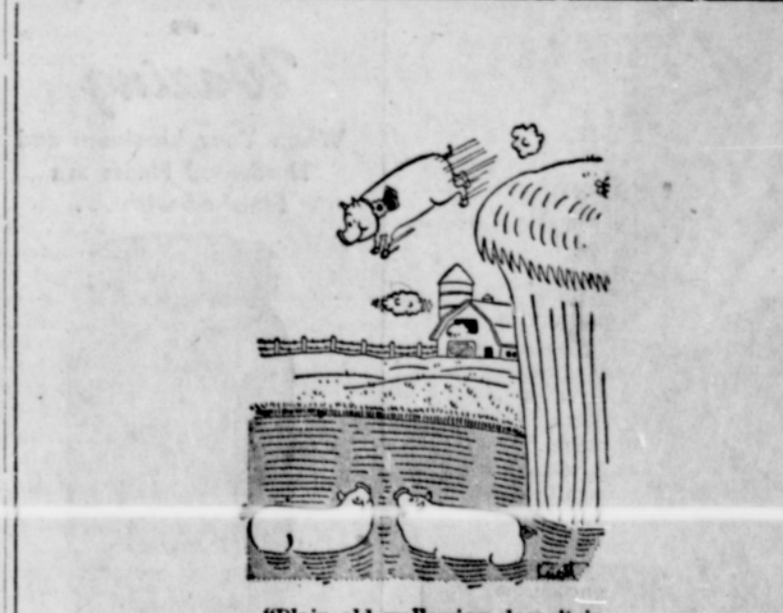
