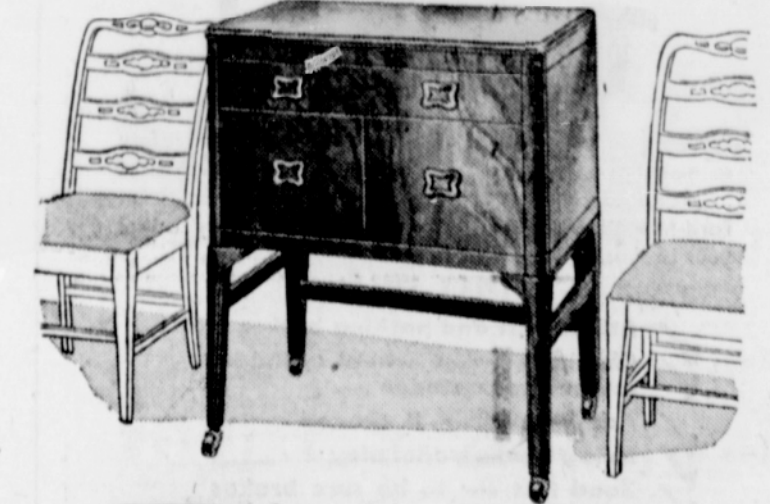

Bruce Lamb spent the Easter holidays with his uncle, George Quackenbush at Veneta.

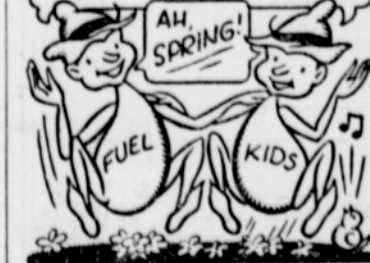
