Local Bank Lists Condition Figures

Statement of condition figures have been released by the First National Bank of Cottage Grove and show that, as of March 31, 1952, deposits at the bank totaled \$7,941,251; loans were \$2,172,550 and resources were \$8,648,559. Figures for the bank, which is an affiliate of the First National Bank of Portland, were released by H.E. Eakin, vice president and cashier.

At the same time, figures were reported for the First National Bank group, consisting of the First National Bank of Portland and its 46 statewide banking offices and 15 affiliated banks with 18 offices. On March 31, 1952, deposits were \$654,796,937, loans were \$327,044,659 and resources were \$709,968,145.

Over March 31 of last year, First National Bank group deposits increased \$34,086,090, loans increased \$42,729,783 and resources increased \$36,087,906.
