crease when new rates go into effect July 1.

8. Referred to water committee for study proposed contract between the W. A. Woodard Lumber Co. and the city that would call for the city to supply water at 70 pound pressure to the company through the 12 inch main from the city limits with a meter to be installed at the north boundary of the mill property. This would supplant old contract with the city that has been cancelled.

9. Council asked police chief to check on the Golf club sign on Highway 99 north of town in answer to complaints received that it blocked the traffic view.

10. Authorized expenses for the police chief to attend the convention of the Oregon Association of City Police Officers to be held in Portland May 7 and 8.

11. Council took no action on a proposal by the Planning Commission that the city approve a subdivision ordinance submitted by the group. It had been recommended before in 1949 and 1950, but no action taken. One councilman said it would put too many restrictions on a person's right to develop his own property.
