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Creswell Likes Ike, Supports Local Man For Commissioner

CRESWELL — Creswell voters turned out in good numbers at the primary Friday. Each of the north and south precincts numbered over 300 voters. Both the law measures carried with a large majority, but the county manager plan was defeated by a heavy vote.

Dwight D. Eisenhower was the choice of the Republicans for president with Earl Warren of California running second. Ten delegates, all Eisenhower supporters, were also elected to the national convention. Jess Gard was the choice for national committee-man, with a slight lead over Charles Paine.

Harris Ellsworth was again the favorite for representative to congress and Sig Unander won out for state treasurer. Leonard L. Lindas was favored for attorney general.

Rogers Supported
Edward W. Elder received the most votes for sheriff, and Ralph E. Rogers, local candidate for county commissioner, had nearly twice as many votes as his nearest contender, Fred Bartels.

The Democrats favored Monroe Sweetland for national committee-man; Walter Dodd and Walter Dennis as representatives to the national convention; Francis Lambert as state treasurer; Ina S. Randolph as county clerk; Ula D. Brendell as county commissioner and Carl Arney as sheriff.

The counting boards worked until 6 o'clock Saturday morning.

Creswell Bulldogs Down Drain to Win Berth in Semi-Finals May 23 and 24

CRESWELL — The Creswell Bulldogs edged the Drain Warriors 5-4 in a quarter final game of the state tourney played on the home diamond May 17. The eight innings were studded with errors on both sides, but it seemed the Bulldogs had the hitting power edge, with the final run counting in the top of the eighth.

Creswell will play Friday night at Drain for the semi-finals and Saturday night, win or lose, for the first or third spot.

First Scoreless
The first inning was scoreless for both teams as was the second, but in the top of the third the Bulldogs scored the first run. But not to be outdone, the Drain nine came right back to tie it up at 1-1.

As the game progressed both teams scoring and trying to stay ahead. Earl Simpson added a homer on a hit to surge the hole between third and short. It was going fast as Decker came in on it, but as it reached Decker, it hit a rock and leaped over his head. It was a long ways from there.

At the end of the seventh, the score was tied up at 4-4. Then the lead-off hitter for the Bulldogs, which was the catcher Burns, got on base after an infield error. He then stole second. On a hit to left field by Jim Randall, and a bobble, Burns came across the plate with the winning run.

Creswell then took the field to defend that one-run lead. With Zilkoski on the mound for the Bulldogs and Burns behind the plate, they rid two men via the fly-out route and the last man struck out. That was the ball game.

Zilkoski went all the way for the winners, while the losers used three pitchers, starting with Jim Swearington, then Miller and a third. Merrill Zilkoski, Ed Graham and Bob Arient all had doubles for the day, and that helped the home-lopers.

The annual theater party of the F. L. Club will be Tuesday, May 27. Cars will leave Mrs. D. D. Eustad's home at 6 p.m.

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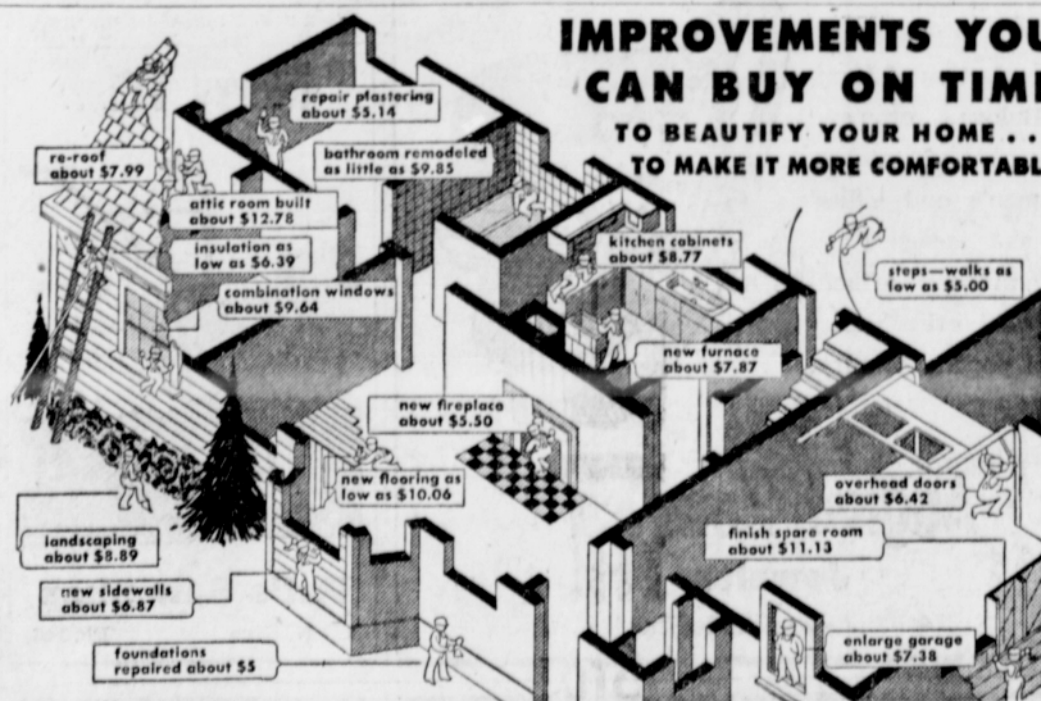
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
