\$35 PER THOUSAND HIGH O & C ORAL AUCTION BID

Five tracts containing a total of 8,845,000 board feet of O & C timber were offered for oral auction at a recent session presided over by District Forester Otto C. F. Krueger.

These brought bids totalling \$219,041.90. Walton Lumber company made the high oral bid of \$35 per thousand board feet for 1,510,000 board feet of Douglas Fir timber.

In sealed bidding five tracts of 2,425,000 board feet of timber brought bids totalling \$71,658.25. Two more timber sales will be held in June and July.
